About the SpeakerHerman Pontzer, Ph.D., Associate Professor of Evolutionary Anthropology and Research Associate Professor of Global Health at Duke University, investigates energy expenditure and evolution in humans and other apes. Through laboratory and field studies, Dr. Pontzer's work seeks to understand how our bodies evolved and how our deep past shapes our lives today. He and colleagues conducted the first measurements of daily energy expenditure in traditional hunter-gatherers, the Hadza of northern Tanzania. Surprisingly, despite lifestyles that are incredibly active, Dr. Pontzer and colleagues found that hunter-gatherers expend the same number of calories each day as sedentary Westerners. He is ...

About the Talk Since most breast cancer deaths are due to progressive invasive disease, the ability to detect pre-invasive lesions is an important public health problem. The research in my group will lead to the clinical implementation of a low-cost, low-dose Positron Emission Mammography (PEM) imager which will increase the ability of physicians to detect and treat pre-invasive breast cancers thus avoiding the more expensive treatment of patients with potentially metastatic disease. Our goal is to advance the field of breast cancer detection beyond the current standard of care particularly for those women who are at high risk of breast ...
