

Native Nurses Entry Program Application Package Information:

Who should apply to the Native Nurses Entry Program?

Any individual of Aboriginal descent, whether you're a recent high school graduate or not, should consider applying!

What are the admission requirements to the Native Nurses Entry Program?

All applicants must complete (within the last 5 years): Grade 10 U or C Science, and Grade 11 or 12 U or C Chemistry. Applicants are recommended to complete Grade 11 or Grade 12 U or C Biology; however, this is optional.

Please read the following instructions prior to starting your application:

Step 1: Complete each section on the Native Nurses Entry Program Application on the next page.

Step 2: Order official copies of all previous academic transcript(s).

• A transcript is considered official when it is sent directly from the institution or is delivered by the applicant in a sealed envelope.

Step 3: Complete and submit the **two Reference Forms** that follow the application.

- References may include, but are not limited to, a teacher, a nurse, a clergyman, an Elder or a
 community member. Your choice of reference should include individuals who can attest to your
 potential as a nursing student and your demonstrated personal suitability for nursing practice.
- Your references cannot be family members.

Step 4: Submit Your Personal Resume.

 On a separate document, please list your: work experiences (including raising children), volunteer activities, and educational background. Include such details as the name of the employer or volunteer organization, position title, responsibilities, and the time involved.

Step 5: Complete and submit your Personal Statement that follows the application and reference forms.

Once you have completed all of the above, please submit all documentation, including transcripts, to:

Native Nurses Entry Program Frequently Asked Questions:

How do I order my transcripts?

To order your secondary school transcript, contact your high school, or the appropriate school board to have one printed. If the institution will not mail a copy to Enrolment Services – Undergraduate Admissions, have them seal it in an envelope. You can drop off or resend the sealed envelope to Enrolment Services – Undergraduate Admissions. Our mailing address is below.

To order any post-secondary transcript(s), contact the Enrolment Services Department, or the Office of the Registrar at each institution, and request to have a copy of your transcripts mailed to:

I heard there is an interview as part of the admissions process. What can I expect?

After you have submitted all of your required documentation, you may be selected for an interview. If so, you will be notified by the Native Nurses Entry Program Office of your interview date and time. The interview is normally 30 minutes in length and consists of a panel called the Selection Committee. The Selection Committee members may include: the Aboriginal Counsellor/Liaison, an Aboriginal Nurse or nursing student, an Aboriginal Educator, and the Registrar or designate. A support person (e.g. spouse, relative, or friend) is encouraged to attend the interview with you.

During the interview, statements will be presented by the Selection Committee to stimulate discussion. The interview will give you an opportunity to express your desires and future goals for a health career, as well as, clarify questions the Selection Committee members may have. In an interview your best resource is yourself. It is important to be on time and to be relaxed. We understand you will be nervous but we hope to provide a comfortable, non-threatening environment for you.

During the interview what types of questions could I be asked?

- How did you become interested in Nursing as a career choice?
- Have you worked or volunteered for a health-related organization or community health agency?
- What has been your academic background to date?
- What difficulties do you foresee in attending university?
- How do you deal with stressful situations (e.g. being a student, possibly living away from family and friends, etc.)?
- While providing examples, tell us about your problem solving abilities. What lessons have you learned?
