Riding Co-Directors will graduate our fellowship in May with competitive and transferable job skills, a Certificate of Fellowship Completion, and a reference from Future Majority staff to support your career.

### **About Future Majority**

Future Majority is a Canadian non-partisan, non-profit organization that was founded to activate Canada's largest voting bloc (millennials and gen z) to make sure that all politicians and parties address the concerns of young people. Being a by-youth, for-youth organization, our goal is to unite the voice of youth across Canada, build political power together, and ultimately put youth and our priorities at the centre of Canadian politics.

### **Co-Director Volunteer Fellowship Description**

Future Majority is seeking hardworking, passionate individuals to help us build massive volunteer teams, which can mobilize tens of thousands of young Canadians in our next federal election. If an election is not called this Spring, our team won't stop – Co-Director Fellows will run a huge campaign pressuring major party leaders to propose real solutions to the issues that matter most to young people.

As a Riding Co-Director Fellow you will receive exclusive trainings and work with other Co-Directors and the Future Majority staff to:

- Recruit and manage a team of 5-10 committed volunteers
- Organize your friends, family, and extended network to get involved
- Turn out 750 young voters in a highly competitive, top-priority riding
- Make a difference!

Through a series of specialized workshops, hands-on practicum, and weekly staff coaching, you will graduate this fellowship with experience and skills in:

- Running interviews
- Training others effectively
- Coaching for success
- Public speaking
- Digital engagement

The position is a great opportunity to meet and connect with passionate, talented young people nationwide and grow political power amongst the largest voting block in Canada: youth!

This volunteer role requires a weekly time commitment of 5-10 hours per week from February 15, 2021 to April 26, 2021 (10 weeks). If an election is called, hours may increase for the final push.

Upon receiving your application, our team will review it and follow up quickly to schedule an interview if we think there is a potential fit.

We'd especially like to encourage Indigenous people, people of colour, women, people identifying as LGBTQ2S, immigrants and people with disabilities to apply. We recognize that this list is not exhaustive. Qualified persons are encouraged to apply regardless of their religious affiliation, race, age, sex, sexual orientation or nature of disability.*

While we are looking to specifically fill this role we are also looking to build a team to continue to spread this movement. There will be lots of opportunities to be involved and develop leadership skills.
