

Honours Bachelor of Social Work 1-Year Program

The one year HBSW is designed for students who have already attained an undergraduate degree in another discipline and wish to receive the training and professional qualification to allow them to enter into the profession of Social Work. The program offers the course content of the professional years of the HBSW program in a compressed, intensive 12 month time frame.

APPLYING

If you have already completed either a 3 or 4 year university degree, then you would be eligible to apply for our One Year Program, which commences every July. This program offers a dynamic and challenging Social Work education that builds upon your previous university, volunteer and work experience.

Applications are due in December of each year. The One-Year program begins in July.

To enter the One Year Program, it is helpful to know that admission is based on the four areas listed below. The weight assigned to each area is listed in brackets.

- 1. Academic grades, based on the 10 most recent undergraduate/graduate university level, full course equivalents, completed at the time of application. A minimum average of 70% is required. (40%)
- 2. Volunteer and work experience (15%)
- 3. References (20%)
- 4. A personal statement exam (25%)
