- Helping clients to understand and address their inner conflicts;
- Carrying out different forms of psychotherapy, utilizing commonly recognized frameworks such as CBT, DBT, EFT, EMDR and other therapeutic modalities as required and as different clinical situations dictate;
- Developing detailed and organized session notes, directly within our digital client management system on a contemporaneous basis;
- Participation in clinical roundtables, concurrently receiving clinical oversight and supervision and participating in offering clinical guidance on other files;
- Able to be accommodating and flexible with work hours, occasionally including evenings and weekends to meet the demand of client schedules;
- Development and delivery of group programs and presentations to clinical and community groups;
- Commitment to continuous improvement by way of continuing education, supplementary training and active professional participation in the mental health community;
- Reflecting the mission and values of Dorset Pier Mental Health in a respectful and professional manner at all times.



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QUALIFICATIONS

Dorset Pier Mental Health is Thunder Bay's first mental health clinic to focus on animal assisted psychotherapy. While psychotherapy associates are not required to practice with the assistance of animals, they must at a minimum be comfortable handling and being in the presence of the practice's therapy animals.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

At Dorset Pier Mental Health, we understand that the impact of one's physical environment is often overlooked when it comes to addressing mental health concerns.

Research shows that when our environment feels dark, we can feel dark; when our environment feels chaotic, we can feel chaotic; and, when our environment doesn't feel judgment-free, we can feel judged. Accordingly, we have spent a significant amount of time ensuring that our counselling offices are warm, welcoming and comforting. It's like nothing else in Thunder Bay.

Our full-time professionals enjoy compressed weekdays (8:30 am to 2:30 pm OR 2:30 pm to 8:30 pm), shortened Fridays (8:30 am to 1:00 pm OR 1:00 pm to 5:30 pm) and alternating weekends (10:00 am to 5:00 pm), for a total of 32 hours per week (64 hours over 2 weeks), of which no more than 21.5 hours are spent in session (43 hours over 2 weeks). Employer RSP contributions and a comprehensive benefits plan round out the total compensation for full-time professionals.

Alternative part-time staffing arrangements will also be considered, where the benefits and compensation would be pro-rated to one's professional involvement.
