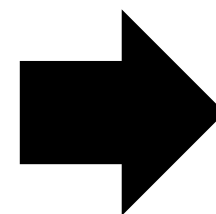
# MSW Project Track

**Fall Graduation: 1 or 2 Year Completion**

## Fall Term (1 year)

### Fall - Winter Terms (2 years)

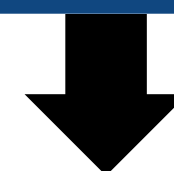
- Review practicum manual; meet with Graduate Field Coordinator to discuss practicum goals
- Begin researching potential project topics
- Gear as many assignments as possible to broad topic for project
- By end of term - narrow focus to a specific project topic



## Winter Term (1 year)

### Spring - Summer Terms (2 years)

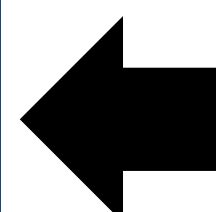
- If topic is not yet narrowed, work with supervisor early in the term to determine topic
- Gear as many assignments as possible to broad topic for project
- Conduct research on project report topic



## Summer Term (1 year)

### Spring - Summer Terms (2 years)

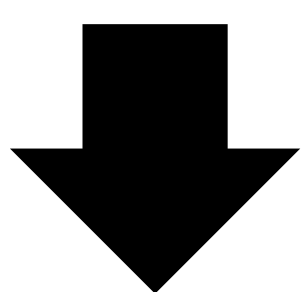
- Continue drafting project and making revisions as necessary with supervisors guidance
- Anticipate a 2-week response time from faculty supervisor when requesting a review of project report progress



## Spring Term (1 year)

### Fall - Winter Terms (2 years)

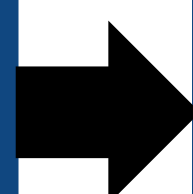
- Begin drafting sections of project report
- Receive feedback on drafted sections
- Make revisions based on supervisors feedback
- Discussions with supervisor to identify second reader; supervisor approaches second reader



## Supervisor

By late June/early July final draft of project report should be completed

Anticipate a 3-week response time when final draft is submitted

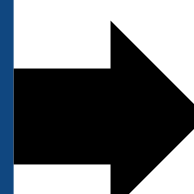


## Second Reader

Second reader draft should be ready by mid July

Anticipate a 3-week response time from second reader

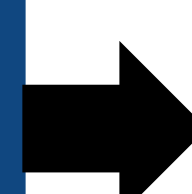
(Supervisor may request an external third reviewer)



## Revisions

By early-mid August student receives second readers comments

Student makes required changes before end of August



## Graduate Coordinator

Final approval is granted by the graduate coordinator

Intended Graduation Fall (October): final change of grades for all courses must be submitted by early September
