EDUC 1050 Introduction to Education

A critical introduction to the theory and practice of teaching with a focus on the development of teacher identity.

Knowledge about the structure and function of education in Ontario's publicly-funded schools and current trends and issues in education will be examined.

EDUC 2050 Introduction to Teaching

An introduction to effective teaching practices in K-12 classrooms that includes a 35-hour field placement in which students have the opportunity to apply select practices with primarily small groups of learners.

Education Elective EDUC 3910 Special Topics in Education

Topics in education that address current issues and practices in the field.
