The Chair of the Senate Teaching and Learning Committee reported that following the February 10th Senate meeting, steps were taken to allow instructors to "opt out" of the online evaluation for the Winter 2014 term. Institutional Analysis and Government Relations worked with Technology Services Centre to update the "opt out" option on MyInfo. From February 17th to the 21st emails were sent to Deans and

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instructors to inform them of the "opt out" option, with a deadline date of February 26th.

Following the deadline, 75% of winter term instructors chose to conduct their teaching evaluations online and 25% chose to conduct their teaching evaluation through the paper process. The online evaluation results for the Fall 2013 term were released to instructors on March 7th through MyInfo and the paper process results were released to instructors on March 13th.

The Winter 2014 teaching evaluations are available for student feedback. The Senate Teaching and Learning Committee are engaging students through promotional efforts. Communication was noted as critical, to maximize response rates for students.

The Chair noted the most important factor in encouraging students to complete teaching evaluations was through communication with the instructor. The committee encouraged all faculty to visit the Instructional Development Centre website for a number of best practices to promote teaching evaluations to their students. CARRIED
