#### CANADIAN-MEXICAN UNIVERSITIES' ABORIGINAL CONFERENCE

As reported at the last Senate meeting, there will be a national conference bringing ten Canadian universities and ten indigenous universities from Mexico together in Lethbridge, Alberta (June 21-22). The conference will provide opportunities for Lakehead and other Canadian universities to build relationships and develop exchange programs with the Mexican indigenous universities.

The Canada-Mexico round table is a follow up to the first annual conference of university presidents and directors, held in March 2012 in Mexico City. This year's conference begins on June 21, Canada's National Aboriginal Day, and will continue the dialogue on Aboriginal higher education. Lakehead is currently in discussion with three indigenous universities from Mexico as we work to build future partnerships.

Joining me at the conference will be our new Vice-Provost (Aboriginal Initiatives), Cynthis Wesley-Esquimaux, as well as an elder to be appointed by our Ogimaawin-Aboriginal Governance Council.

#### **ACHIEVEMENT PROGRAM WELCOMES CLASS OF 2013**

Our Department of Athletics and Office of Aboriginal Initiatives hosted our Achievement Program's first 'Day On Campus' activity of the year, May 1<sup>st</sup>, for 39 students currently enrolled in the program. The on-campus event offers youth the opportunity to explore Lakehead University and participate in hands-on activities with our Faculty of Engineering, School of Kinesiology, and the Department of Athletics.

Schools involved in the Program include Gron Morgan, Sherbrooke, Algonquin, Agnew-Johnson, C.D. Howe, McKellar Park, and Ogden.

Each school's principal selected students based on First Nations, Métis, and Inuit status, and those facing barriers to post-secondary education. Many of the kids enrolled in our Program never saw graduating from Grade 12 as a possibility.

Achievement Program students must satisfy three conditions to remain in the program:

- Pass their grade
- Participate in school or community activities
- Participate in at least one "Day On Campus" event at Lakehead

Special guests at the event included the Lakehead Public School Board's (LPSB) Director of Education, Catherine Seminic, and LPSB Superintendent, Sheri-Lyn Pherin.

#### **DELEGATION OF LAKEHEAD DEANS VISIT CHINA**

A recent delegation of Lakehead representatives — including Dr. Rod Hanley, Dr. David Barnett, Dr. Ulf Runesson, Dr. Bahram Dadgostar and Mr. Tony Williams — joined our Provost and Vice-President (Academic), Dr. Rod Hanley, as he traveled to China to explore transfer agreements, short-term opportunities, and exchanges for students and faculty with our English Language Program. They met with a number of institutions including the EIC Agency.



Our delegation also visited two high schools (Beijing Concord School and Maple Leaf School), three universities (Hunan University, Nanjin Forestry University, and Anhui Agricultural) it what was an extremely productive trip that provided Lakehead the opportunity to strengthen our relationships and will have a positive effect on recruitment efforts.

#### ABORIGINAL STUDENT NUMBERS UP

Congratulations go out to our Aboriginal Initiatvies and recruitment offices in both Thunder Bay and Orillia. In the 2011-2012 academic year Lakehead had 1140 Aboriginal students. Our objective for this year was to increase that number to 1175 students. I am proud to report that not only did Lakehead meet this objective during the 2012-2013 academic year, we surpassed it with a total of 1203 Aboriginal students — a 5.5% increase.

#### NEW OCAA STATUS BOOSTS ATHLETICS AT LAKEHEAD ORILLIA

The athletics program at Lakehead University's Orillia campus just got a huge boost, with the recent announcement that the campus was accepted as an affiliate member of the Ontario Colleges Athletic Association (OCAA). Lakehead Orillia's official membership status is effective as of May 1, 2013 and opens up opportunities for expanding varsity sports and athletic competition.
