<b>Title</b> Native Arts and Crafts
<b>Description</b> This studio/lecture course focuses on the traditional designs and craft objects associated with the indigenous groups of Canada from immediate pre-contact to the present. Historical and cultural contexts are analyzed as they relate to various Native groups and their artistic production.

<b>CreditWeight</b> 1.0
<b>Rationale</b> The Departments of Visual Arts and Indigenous Learning currently offer this cross-listed course. Historically it has been funded by the Faculty of Education, which has made it something of an anomaly. It is currently a required course in the HBEEd (Aboriginal) PJ degree program offered by the Department of Aboriginal Education. As part of the provincially mandated move to a two year Education program, the Department of Aboriginal Education is moving to more closely align the HBEEd (Aboriginal) program with the P/J program offered by the Department of Undergraduate Studies. As part of this process it is proposed that the VISU/INDI 2060 course be made a third year course in order to provide a better balance between education and non-education courses and open space in the second year program for a new required course.
