Rationale	Rationale The Sociology BA and HBA programs are well-established in Thunder Bay but to date there is no Sociology major in Orillia. Rather, there is only the possibility of a specialization in Sociology as part of a student's degree in Interdisciplinary Studies. This is a proposal, therefore, to begin offering the Sociology BA and HBA programs in Orillia as soon as possible. The Orillia Campus at Lakehead University is growing and evolving. Student enrolment is increasing, and Sociology remains one of the most popular programs. The 2013 Provost's Taskforce on Governance at Orillia has recommended that the present Department of Interdisciplinary Studies be divided into two departments, one containing the physical/natural sciences and the other containing the social sciences and humanities. Almost all of the disciplines at Orillia already have or will soon have a Major, and Sociology would undoubtedly lose out on resources, courses, enrolment, status and appeal if it did not also offer a Major.Offering the Sociology BA and HBA at the Orillia campus will provide students at both campuses with the capacity and opportunity to complete the same rigorous programs. Students in Orillia enrolled in these programs will complete the same number of required and elective courses as though in Thunder Bay, and will complete the exact same required courses.
