Applicants who meet the minimum academic admission requirements as indicated below following the fall term examination period will be reviewed by the Kinesiology Co-op Admissions Committee.
(a) HBK students who have completed Year 1 or Year 2 of the HBK program.
(b) HBK students who have achieved a minimum of 75\% cumulative average in all Kinesiology courses, and a minimum of $65 \%$ cumulative overall average. Admission decisions will be made by January 21st of the winter term preceding the summer work term. Students admitted to the co-op program are required to maintain a current police record check and standard first aid and CPR-C certification. Evidence of these documents must be submitted to the Kinesiology Co-op Advisor each year prior to the end of February.

In addition to the successful completion of each work term placement, continuation in the Co-op option will be contingent upon maintaining a minimum of $75 \%$ cumulative average in all Kinesiology courses, and a minimum of $65 \%$ cumulative overall average, assessed at the end of December of each year.

Graduation from the Co-op option of the Honours Bachelor of Kinesiology program requires, in addition to all academic requirements outlined for the HBK four year program, a minimum of $75 \%$ cumulative average in all Kinesiology courses included in the 22 FCEs counted towards the degree, a minimum of 65\% cumulative overall average and satisfactory completion of four of Kinesiology 2990, 3990, 4990, 4991, 4992.

## Placement Information

The Student Success Centre Coop and Employer Relations Officer, in co-operation with the School of Kinesiology Co-op Advisor and in communication with potential community and work placement partners, will establish the availability of work placements. Each year available work term placement postings will be outlined for the students three months prior to the work term and placements will be categorized and classified as being introductory, intermediate or advanced. The Co-op Work Placement Partner reviews student applications and other pertinent information and ultimately chooses their placement student(s). During this process, employment review information and interviews with placement partners will be organized by the Coop and Employer Relations Officer. Students in the Co-op option are not guaranteed specific work term positions as the application process is competitive.

The student is expected to seek at least two different work term placement locations during the program. The work term experience is assessed on pass/fail grading criteria. Criteria include but are not limited to completion of all required documentation, reports and
