SAC/O-AGC – Course with Indigenous Knowledge/Aboriginal Content

The following tables provide a summary of the results of the survey conducted by the SAC/O-AGC committee in 2013. Academic units were asked to identify courses they currently offer with Indigenous Knowledge/Aboriginal content; whether that content comprises more than 50% of the course; and whether the course is required, has a prerequisite, and has open enrolment. It is important to note that these results do not constitute a Senate-approved list of courses that can be used to fulfill the requirement that all students take at least one .5 FCE with Indigenous Knowledge/Aboriginal content; rather, they are meant to provide Senators with a sense of what courses might be available to fulfill that requirement, particularly to units that anticipate requiring a course from another academic unit as a way to fulfill the requirement. To that end, the final table in the document provides a list of courses that contain greater than 50% Indigenous Knowledge/Aboriginal content, and that have no prerequisite or restricted enrolment. We have included data on courses that have less than 50% content to indicate that there are a number of courses that could be revised such that they would meet the minimum 50% requirement.
