Economic Development & Innovation Office's Research & Innovation Week activities

The Economic Development and Innovation (EDI) office was very excited to have participated in the events and activities during Research & Innovation Week 2017, including an International Women's Day Research Panel discussion, Northern IGNITE, and the presentation of the 2017 Innovation Awards.

International Women's Day Research Panel showcased five of Lakehead University's top female researchers who shared their accomplishments, discussed research challenges, offered advice to students, and were on-hand to answer questions from the audience.

Northern IGNITE was created to highlight the benefit of forming partnerships and collaborations between local industry and Lakehead University students and faculty. Speakers were asked to use the PechaKucha presentation style (20 slides x 20 seconds per slide) while connecting their research to this year's R&I Week theme of sustainability. Presenters included faculty researchers, post-doctoral students, and Lakehead University's Sustainability Coordinator.

Over the past 8 years, the EDI office has presented two awards to celebrate Research and Innovation throughout the previous year: the **Innovation Award** and the **Student Innovation Award**. These two awards are judged using a number of criteria including project impact, alignment to Lakehead University's research themes and strategic goals, and overall contribution to research excellence and innovation. This year's winner of the 2017 Innovation Award was Dr. Alla Reznik, Associate Professor, Physics and the Student Innovation Award recipient was Mr. Sai Swaroop Dalli.

Lakehead University included in the Queen Elizabeth II Scholars Program

Lakehead University is one of 23 Canadian universities to be included in the new Canadian Queen Elizabeth II Diamond Jubilee Advanced Scholars Program. Nationally, more than 450 researchers at the doctoral, postdoctoral and early-career levels will undertake global research, contributing to improved global talent exchange between Canada and other nations.

An award of \$660,000 has been granted to Drs. Brian McLaren and Chander Shahi of Lakehead's Faculty of Natural Resources Management in collaboration with Drs. Charles Levkoe and Mirella Stroink in the University's Faculty of Health and Behavioral Sciences.

The purpose of visit was not only to sign a Memorandum of Understanding between the two institutions for future cooperation of the international relations in the field of academic, scientific and technological research projects but also to meet with 10 indigenous women from the state of Hidalgo who were studying our <u>English Innovation Programs</u> - Indigenous Stream.
