The Senate Teaching and Learning Committee (STLC) met on November 24 and December 12.

The committee approved the Terms of Reference for the following sub-committees: Accessibility; Learning Spaces and Technology; and Writing and Communication.

The committee appointed faculty members to the following sub-committees: Accessibility; Teaching Awards; and Writing and Communication.

The Teaching Awards sub-committee revised the Contribution to Teaching Award Process document and presented a draft to STLC for discussion. A final draft will be presented to the January 9 STLC meeting.

The committee provided feedback on a draft of the Procedures Associated with the Policy on Accommodations and Access for Students with Disabilities/Medical Conditions.

The university will have comprehensive access to Lynda.com, an extensive e-learning site, as early as January 2018. The committee was given a preliminary presentation on this site, and will receive a more comprehensive presentation once the license is active.
