## March 2019

## 2019-2024 Academic Plan

Following the approval of the Academic Plan by Senate in February, planning is underway to begin implementation.

Working with Lakehead's approach to integrated planning and budgeting, implementation of the Academic Plan will be aligned to the University's fiscal years, within Year 1 implementation to commence in May. I will provide an update on our planned implementation approach at the April Senate meeting.

## Bora Laskin Faculty of Law

For the first time, our Faculty of Law moot team has advance to the National "Sopinka Cup" moot championships held March 15-16<sup>th</sup> in Ottawa. Lakehead law students Amanda Gallo and Nathan Wainwright, joined the seven other top teams from across Canada at a reception hosted by the Supreme Court of Canada and they proudly represented the Bora Laskin faculty of Law at this very prestigious mooting competition.

## Library

The spring 2019 <u>Ontario Teacher Education Librarians Association</u> conference will take place at Lakehead in Thunder Bay on May 2 and 3. The Conference is largely being organized by Gisella Scalese as the host of the conference, and by Chris Tomasini as the current copresident of OTELA.

Several classes have made use of the Makerspace@Paterson. Dr. Wely Floriano, Chemistry, asked students to use the 3D printer to create protein molecules. The Teaching Commons and Libraries hosted the inaugural Open Day on March 6. This fullday event (in person in Thunder Bay and in Orillia and online via Zoom) introduced Lakehead's faculty, staff, and students to the potential of Open Education. Helen DeWaard, Faculty of Education (Orillia) convened from the Orillia Campus. Sessions included an overview of the open education movement, where to find Open Educational Resources (OERs), creating and adapting OERs, myth-busting OERs, and a session on the Creative Commons and copyright. #### Financial Literacy Early Outreach with Grade 8 Students
