Decanal Reviews

The Decanal Reviews have been completed. Dr. Lori Livingston has been renewed as the Dean of the Faculty of Health and Behavioural Sciences. Dr. Gillian Siddall has been renewed as Dean of the Faculty of Social Sciences and Humanities.

Faculty of Engineering

Dr. Rachid Benlamri from Software Engineering received an OCE/NSERC-Engage/Connect Canada research grant for his project "Automated Web Data Extraction for Canadian Fundraising Institutions." This research focuses on the need to develop sophisticated methods and tools to automatically locate, filter and extract the desired content, and transform it into structured knowledge that is advantageous to the business. These tools, known as Web scrapers, represent an active research field involving techniques from the Semantic Web, text processing, semantic understanding and Human-Computer Interactions (HCI). The project is in collaboration with industrial partner Charter Press Ltd in Orillia.

Faculty of Natural Resources Management

In late fall the NRM Faculty was part of a evaluation program for the implementation of Unmanned Aerial Vehicles (UAVs or drones) for forest inventory updates with a variety of sensors including multi-spectral, hyperspectral, thermal and LIDAR. The results are now being utilized to enhance the hands-on components of a number of required and elective geomatics courses. The learning experience was also incorporated in an "enhanced Forest Resource Inventory training module for managers" executed in the beginning of February 2014 in Orillia. The NRM Faculty is now partnering with a UAV service provider for increased access to UAV data for teaching and research.

The NRM Faculty has reached agreements with two East-European schools for undergraduate NRM students to conduct their Fall 2014 two-week field school in Croatia and the Czech Republic.

The 45th Annual Student Symposium was held at the end of January with the topic being the Ring of Fire. The following external speakers were featured: Peter Hinz from the Ring of Fire Secretariat; Bryce Barker - Mineral Exploration & Development Consultant with MNMD; Kimberly Jorgenson - Environmental Assessment Officer with Four Rivers, Matawa; and Ramsey Hart - Canada Program Coordinator, Mining Watch.

Faculty of Science and Environmental Studies

Dr. Andrew Conly in the department of Geology was awarded a NSERC CRD grant for \$76,750, which was supplemented by another \$60,600 from Zenyatta Ventures to work on the company's Albany graphite deposit. Dr. Andrew Conly observed, "Evidence has shown that Zenyatta has discovered a unique sub-class of a hydrothermal graphite deposit unlike

any other. Igneous breccia-hosted graphite deposits like Albany are very rare, and to the best of my knowledge, none are currently being mined or even in an advanced stage of exploration globally. Our on-going research of the Albany deposit will establish the first genetic model for this distinctive type of graphite."

Preliminary Ontario High School (101) Application Update - The preliminary application deadline for Ontario high school students passed on January 15, 2014. Based on initial application numbers, Lakehead has declined -6.7% in applications compared to the same time last year. System-wide, the number of 101 applicants has decreased by -3.5% (-3,282 applicants) and the number of applications has also decreased by -0.8% (-3,453 applications) compared to the same time last year. This is the first time in many years (since 2004) that the sector has experienced a decline in 101 applicants.

These application numbers remain preliminary. Applications continue to be accepted and processed throughout the cycle.

Efforts aimed at continuing to recruit undergraduate students for Fall 2014 continue. Conversion efforts are also underway. The continued involvement and participation of the university community is critical to our overall success and greatly appreciated.
