She is a registered member of the Ontario College of Social Work. In 2021, Bryanna obtained a Ph.D. degree in Educational Studies and takes pride in being an alumnus of Lakehead University.

Bryanna has worked in various roles, including as a consultant for the Public Health Agency of Canada, a manager of programs and services at Confederation College, and the coordinator of Indigenous education programs at Lakehead University. Bryanna has taught a variety of Indigenous content at Lakehead, Laurentian, Trent, and the University of Toronto.

Bryanna has recently wrapped up two terms as a board member at Shkoday Aboriginal Head Start and is currently part of the Thunder Bay Catholic District School Board Indigenous Education Council member. Bryanna was recently part of the search committee looking for the Northern Ontario School of Medicine's first Chancellor.
