**Dr. Michael Rennie**, an assistant professor in Biology at Lakehead University and Canada Research Chair in Freshwater Ecology and Fisheries, oversaw the first ever study of microplastics in Lake Winnipeg. His work revealed concentrations higher than those reported in Lake Huron and Lake Superior, and similar to those reported in Lake Erie.




# **Community Engagement**

## MOU signed with CITNOVA

On March 21, Lakehead University welcomed a delegation from CITNOVA (Council for Science, Technology and Innovation of the Government of the State of Hidalgo, Mexico) on March 20<sup>th</sup> and March 21<sup>st</sup>.

The delegation consisted of **Jose Alonso Huerta Cruz, Director General**, Alejandro Ordaz Teissier, Director of Talent Management, and Marcela Alvarez Guevara, Director of Entrepreneurship.

The purpose of visit was not only to sign a Memorandum of Understanding between the two institutions for future cooperation of the international relations in the field of academic, scientific and technological research projects but also to meet with 10 indigenous women from the state of Hidalgo who were studying our <u>English Innovation Programs</u> - Indigenous Stream.



## Maple Leaf Schools visit
