Homo naledi's surprisingly young age opens up more questions on where we come from

On May 9, scientists announced that South Africa's Rising Star Cave system has revealed yet more important discoveries, only a year and a half after it was announced that the richest fossil hominin site in Africa had been discovered, and that it contained a new hominin species named *Homo naledi* by the scientists who described it.

Dr. Matt Tocheri, Canada Research Chair in Human Origins at Lakehead University, was involved with the comparative analysis of the wrist and hand bones from the new *Homo naledi* material from the Lesedi Chamber.
