Section 1

Description of the Proposed Calendar Change:

To align our calendar entries with the Senate change approved May 2011, reducing the requirement FCEs for teachables at the senior level from 1.0 FCE to 0.5 FCE. In addition, to add the requirement of a Kinesiology or Physical Education degree for students applying for health and physical education as a first teachable at the I/S level.

Rationale of the Proposed Calendar Change(s):

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The original calendar change submission stipulating 0.5 FCE at the senior level taken towards a teachable (first and second) was approved at the May 13, 2011 Senate meeting. The rationale for the change was to align regulation with practice as some students (Math and Science in particular) had difficulty obtaining 1.0 FCE at the senior level. As a result the proposed calendar change is to tidy up calendar entries and link lists of teachables and exceptions to the Department of undergraduate Studies in Education page (<http://mycoursecalendar.lakeheadu.ca/pg19.html>).

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This has been the practice for many years and this is to align the regulation with practice.

B. Junior/Intermediate Specialization

Prior to Entry into Professional Year
In concurrent education programs at the Junior/Intermediate level, students must meet and complete requirements of the partnering honours bachelor degree program prior to entry into the Professional Year including:

7. At least 3 FCEs in a teachable subject, with at least one half-course (i.e., a minimum of 0.5 FCE) at the third or fourth-year level, 5 FCEs if the teachable is French, a Music or Visual Arts degree if the teachable is Music or Visual Arts, and a Computer Science degree if the teachable is Computer Studies. For recognized teachable subjects for J/I students see Department of Undergraduate Studies in Education, Levels and Teachables section.

C. Intermediate/Senior Specialization

6. At least 5 FCEs in a first teachable subject and 3 FCEs in a second teachable subject, with at least one half-course (i.e., a minimum of 0.5 FCE) at the third or fourth-year level in each teachable subject (5 FCEs if the teachable is French, and a Computer Science, Music or Visual Arts degree if the teachable is Computer Studies, Music or Visual Arts). For recognized I/S teachable subjects see Department of Undergraduate Studies in Education, Levels and Teachables section.

Levels and Teachables

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C. Intermediate/Senior Specialization

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Levels and Teachables

Junior/Intermediate (Grades 4 to 10).

Teachers at this level must be prepared to teach students all subjects so programs include courses in a variety of subjects taught in the elementary school. Students must also have additional background (3 full course equivalents, except French and Music), in one of the following teachable subjects, with at least one half-course at the third or fourth-year level: Computer Studies (Computer Science degree required), English, French as a Second Language (5 FCEs required), Geography, Health and Physical Education, History, Mathematics, Music - Instrumental (Music Degree required), Music - Vocal (Music Degree required), Native Languages, Native Studies, Science - General*, and Visual Arts.

*Sciences used towards the General Science teachable may be a combination of:

Anthropology (Science courses only), Biology, Chemistry, Environmental Studies (Science Stream only), Geology (Earth Sciences), and Physics. The Professional Year includes a methodology course on the curriculum and instruction of the teachable subject. In J/I the teachable subject is normally, but not necessarily always, the same as the major subject of the bachelor's degree.

Intermediate/Senior (Grades 7 to 12).

Intermediate/Senior students must take courses in two teachable subjects. Students must have a minimum of 5 FCEs in their first teachable and a minimum of 3 FCEs in their second teachable. In either case, at least one half-course must be at a senior level and exceptions to this are noted below. ("Senior level" denotes courses at a third- or fourth-year undergraduate level.)

Exceptions:

Business Studies - Accounting - Business can only be taken as a first teachable. At least 1 FCE of the Business courses must be in Accounting.

Computer Studies - Requires a Computer Science degree.

Environmental Science - Students who designate Environmental Science as a teachable will be streamed into the Outdoor

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Exception:

Health and Physical Education-Students are not required to have 0.5 FCE at the third or fourth-year level.

Intermediate/Senior (Grades 7 to 12).

Intermediate/Senior students must take courses in two teachable subjects. Students must have a minimum of 5 FCEs in their first teachable and a minimum of 3 FCEs in their second teachable. At least one half-course (i.e., a minimum of 0.5 FCE) must be at the third- or fourth-year level in each teachable subject and exceptions to this are noted below.

Exceptions:

Business Studies - Accounting - Business can only be taken as a first teachable. At least 1 FCE of the Business courses must be in Accounting.

Computer Studies - Requires a Computer Science degree.

Ecological and Experiential Education (OE3) cohort. Entry into OE3 requires either 5 FCEs (first teachable) or 3 FCEs (second teachable) from any combination of Environmental Science, Environmental Education, Ecological Education, Ecology, Biology, Chemistry, Geography, Geology, Outdoor Recreation, Physics, or up to three from any of the following disciplines: Anthropology; English; Forestry; French, History; Native Studies; Philosophy; Physical Education/Kinesiology; Sociology, or Psychology. At least 1 course must be at a senior level.

French (as a Second Language) - Requires 5 FCEs in French for a first or second teachable, at least 1 FCE of which must be at a senior level.

Health and Physical Education - Students applying for health and physical education as a second teachable are not required to have 1 FCE at a senior level.

Music - Requires a Music degree.

Native Languages (with the language stipulated) - Students may use a Native Language Teacher Certificate of Qualification from the Ontario College of Teachers to qualify for Native Language as a second teachable.

Science - General - Courses used toward General Science may be any combination of at least two of: Anthropology (Science courses only), Astronomy, Biology, Chemistry, Environmental Studies (Science Stream only), Geology (Earth Sciences), Meteorology and Physics.

Social Sciences - General - Can only be taken as a second teachable (requiring 3 FCEs, at least 1 FCE of which must be at a senior level). Courses counted toward this teachable may be any combination of at least two of: Anthropology, Philosophy, Psychology and Sociology.

Visual Arts - Requires a Visual Arts or Fine Arts degree.

Environmental Science - Students who designate Environmental Science as a teachable will be streamed into the Outdoor Ecological and Experiential Education (OE3) cohort. Entry into OE3 requires either 5 FCEs (first teachable) or 3 FCEs (second teachable) from any combination of Environmental Science, Environmental Education, Ecological Education, Ecology, Biology, Chemistry, Geography, Geology, Outdoor Recreation, Physics, or up to three from any of the following disciplines: Anthropology; English; Forestry; French, History; Native Studies; Philosophy; Physical Education/Kinesiology; Sociology, or Psychology.

French (as a Second Language) - Requires 5 FCEs in French for a first or second teachable.

Health and Physical Education - Requires a Kinesiology or Physical Education degree if applying as a first teachable. Students applying for health and physical education as a second teachable are not required to have 0.5 FCE at a senior level.

II Requirements for Admission to Undergraduate Degree Programs

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2. Junior/Intermediate (Grade 4-10)
Candidates interested in teaching in the Junior-Intermediate specialization will be

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required to have one specific teaching subject ("teachable") consisting of a minimum of three (3) full course equivalents in the "teachable" area (five (5) full course equivalents for French as a Second Language and a music degree for Music).

Preference for entrance into the One-Year BEd program will be given to applicants who have also completed a minimum of three (3) core curriculum courses in subjects such as English, French, Geography, History, Mathematics, Native Language (Second Language), pure Science, Art, Music and Physical Education.

Junior-Intermediate teaching subjects available at the Faculty of Education at Lakehead University include: Computer Studies, English, French as a Second Language (5 FCEs required), Geography, Health and Physical Education, History, Mathematics, Music - Instrumental (Music Degree required), Music - Vocal (Music Degree required), Native Languages, Native Studies, Science - General*, and Visual Arts.

*Sciences used towards the General Science teachable may be a combination of:

Anthropology (Science courses only), Biology, Chemistry, Environmental Studies (Science Stream only), Geology (Earth Sciences) and Physics.

The Professional Year includes a methodology course on the curriculum and instruction of the teachable subject.

3. Intermediate/Senior (Grade 7-12)


