SUBJECT: Report of Senate Undergraduate Studies Committee – Part I

DATE: 16 January 2012

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The Senate Undergraduate Studies Committee met on January 12, 2012 to review items for the 2012-2013 Academic Cycle referred from Senate and previously deferred by the Committee, and make the following recommendations that have been forwarded to the Senate Budget Committee for their consideration:

A. CALENDAR CHANGES REFERRED FROM SENATE MEETING #2011-10 OF DECEMBER 7, 2011, ITEM 4

1. FACULTY OF BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION

(a) College Transfer Program (2012-2013)

The Committee recommends the revisions to the College Transfer Programs, as described in the revised document, Attachment #1.

(b) Change in Admission Requirements for HBComm & BAdmin Program (2012-2013)

The Committee recommends approval of the revisions to the admission requirements for high school Mathematics and the proposed new course, Business 1036, with revisions as worded in Attachment #2.

2. FACULTY OF EDUCATION

(a) Remove EDUC 3296 and consequently remove as prerequisite for EDUC 3297 (2012-2013)

The Committee recommends that Senate approve the removal of Education 3296 and proposed changes to Education 3297, with revisions. The offering hours of instruction should be "0-0; 1.5-0". Rather than a prerequisite statement, the information should be included in the Notes as a restriction "Four-year Concurrent Education students must have completed either Education 1499 or 2399".

B. CALENDAR CHANGES REFERRED FROM SENATE MEETING #2011-10 OF DECEMBER 7, 2011, ITEM 4

1. FACULTY OF EDUCATION

Regarding the course descriptions of Education 4245, 4218, 4118, 4018, and 3255, previously recommended by the Committee for approval by Senate on January 20th, the Committee recommends further revisions, as noted below.

Change the course description of EDUC 4245 (2012-2013)

Change the course description of EDUC 4218 (2012-2013)

To change the title and course description of EDUC 4118 (2012-2013)

To change the course description for EDUC 4018 (2012-2013)

In EDUC 4245, 4218, 4118, and 4018, make two further revisions. Instead of "this course provides", reword as "students will be introduced to". Instead of "physical literacy and social justice" reword as "physical and health literacy and equity based practices".

To change course description for EDUC 3255 (2012-2013)

In EDUC 3255, revise the first sentence wording from "this course provides students with the chance to learn about" to "students will be introduced to". Revise the second sentence from "social justice" to "equity based practice". Also in the second sentence, revise "this course questions... encourages students" to read instead "students will be given an opportunity to question".

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The Senate Undergraduate Studies Committee met on January 26, 2012 and February 2, 2012 to review items for the **2012-2013** Academic Cycle referred from the January 20, 2012 Senate meeting, and make the following recommendations that have been forwarded to the Senate Budget Committee for their consideration:

CALENDAR CHANGES REFERRED FROM SENATE MEETING #1-2012 OF JANUARY 20, 2012, ITEM 4

1. FACULTY OF SCIENCE AND ENVIRONMENTAL STUDIES

(a) Updates to accommodate mathematics changes and revise upper level mathematics electives in Computer Science programs (2012-2013)

The Committee recommends approval of the proposed revisions to the Computer Science Programs.

(b) Update to Co-op regulations for Computer Science programs (2012-2013)

The Committee recommends approval of the deletion of the sentence, regarding Departmental approval, between Second and Third Years in the Business Option, Science Option, and Hardware Option of the Honours BSc (Computer Science) Cooperative Program and the addition of the information in the course descriptions of the Computer Science co-op courses, with one revision. The prerequisite statement should be "Permission of the Chair of the Department" instead of the proposed wording.

(c) Update math requirements for the BA/BEEd/P/J, J/I, and I/S programs (2012-2013)

The Committee recommends that Senate approve the revisions to the three concurrent Education programs with Mathematics Major.

2. FACULTY OF NATURAL RESOURCES MANAGEMENT

(a) Corrections to Existing Calendar FORE 2051 and FORE 3131 (2012-2013)

The Committee recommends that Senate approve the addition of a prerequisite to FORE 3131 and the revision to the offering/hours of instruction for FORE 2051.

(b) Corrections to Existing Calendar List of Electives for HBEM Conservation Planning Management stream (2012-2013)

The Committee recommends approval of the replacement of GEOG 4211 with 4411 in the HBEM program, Specialization in Conservation Planning and Management.

(c) New Summer Transition Course for HBScF and HBEM (2012-2013)

The Committee recommends that Senate approve the proposed new course, NRMT 2713 – Natural Resources Science D and the addition, in both Programs and Admission Requirements sections of the Calendar, of the new Transition Program for Environmental Technology diploma students who will take 3 of the 4 transition courses during August, and receive additional counseling.

3. FACULTY OF ENGINEERING

(a) Replace ENGI 2151 with an equivalent science/engineering course ENGI 3335 and add a lab component (2012-2013)

The Committee recommends approval of this proposal, with clarifications. The asterisk note regarding ENGI 2151 will be placed in the Civil Engineering program, Second Year Fall Term, to provide college transfer students the opportunity to use equivalent courses for admission purposes. Also, the addition in ENGI 3335 is a one-hour tutorial.

(b) Addition of elective ENGI 0XXX (2012-2013)

The Committee recommends approval of the new Mechanical Engineering elective, Engineering 0670 – Combustion and Emissions, with one-hour tutorial.

(c) Remove ENGI 3337 from 3rd year Fall term of Chemical Engineering and replace with ENGI 3XXX Process Safety (2012-2013)

The Committee recommends that Senate approve the proposal with clarifications. The Engineering Elective, ENGI 0632 – Process Safety, is to be deleted and replaced with the new Engineering Degree Course, ENGI 3333 – Process Safety. In the BEng (Chemical Engineering) program, Third Year Fall Term, ENGI 3337 is to be removed and the new ENGI 3333 will be added as a required course, and in the List of Chemical Engineering Electives ENGI 4056 is to be removed.

(d) Change Math course grouping for minimum average requirements (2012-2013)

The Committee recommends approval of the correction to the Mathematics average requirement in the Engineering Common Year in Applied Science.

4. DEPARTMENT OF INTERDISCIPLINARY STUDIES (ORILLIA)

All items below from the Department of Interdisciplinary Studies were deferred for further consideration.

(a) Defining the requirement for the Psychology specialization for the HBASc and BASc in Interdisciplinary Studies at the Orillia Campus (2012-2013)

(b) Defining the requirement for the Anthropology specialization for the HBASc and BASc in Interdisciplinary Studies at the Orillia Campus (2012-2013)

(c) Defining the requirement for the Biology specialization for the HBASc and BASc in Interdisciplinary Studies at the Orillia Campus (2012-2013)

(d) Defining the requirement for the Geography specialization for the HBASc and BASc in Interdisciplinary Studies at the Orillia Campus (2012-2013)

(e) Defining the requirement for the History specialization for the HBASc and BASc in Interdisciplinary Studies at the Orillia Campus (2012-2013)

(f) Defining the requirement for the Sociology specialization for the HBASc and BASc in Interdisciplinary Studies at the Orillia Campus (2012-2013)

(g) A new Area C requirement that all Honours English students & HBASc English majors complete at least 1 FCE courses in this Area (2012-2013)

(c) Add New 3rd Year Half Course, Gender in Contemporary Social Life (2012-2013)

The Committee recommends approval of the proposed new course, SOCI 3550/WOME 3550 – Gender in Contemporary Social Life, with revisions. The description should also include: prerequisite “Sociology 1100 or Women’s Studies 1100 or permission of the instructor”, offering hours of “3-0; or 3-0”, and the restrictive Note “Students who have previous credit in Sociology 3113 or Women’s Studies 3111 with the topic title “Gender” may not take SOCI 3350/WOME 3550 for credit”.

(d) Critical Studies in Feminist Art History (2012-2013)
