Rationale of Proposed Calendar Change(s):

1. The Psychology Department changed their Abnormal Psychology course code from 3001 to 2004. This change in course number must be reflected in the Criminology major, pathways, and specialization curriculums in the calendar.

2. Across the province, colleges have replaced the Law and Security Administration diploma with a Protection, Security, and Investigation diploma. The calendar must be updated to reflect this province-wide change.

3. The minor in Criminology was created before the major was developed. The current courses in the minor do not reflect the breadth of courses that will now be offered. The calendar should reflect this change.
