Description: Examinations designed to assess the student's ability to integrate and critically evaluate area(s) of psychology from a scientific perspective. The area(s) selected must be unrelated to the student's dissertation area. For the Clinical Psychology PhD students, one examination can take one of three forms: a written comprehensive paper, a closed-book oral examination, or an original research project that results in a research paper. For the Psychological Science PhD students, two written, 4-hour, closed-book exams must be taken by PhD Year 2. Examination areas must be approved by two science comprehensive committee members selected by the student and approved by the Psychological Science Director. Research areas are based on committee-approved student-generated reading lists. The science comprehensive committee evaluates the closed-book written examinations. The exams are written on separate, 4-hour sessions. Students work independently on the examination.

Notes: Non-credit required course.

Psychology 6812 (9812) Clinical Science
Comprehensive Exam
Credit Weight: 0.0

Description: The purpose of the Clinical Science Comprehensive Exam is to assess the Clinical Ph-D- student's ability to integrate and critically evaluate an area of psychology from a scientific perspective. **The exam** it can take one of two forms – a written comprehensive paper or an original research project that results in a research paper. The student works independently on **his/her** their comprehensive, which should be outside the student's area of dissertation research. The area must be approved by three comprehensive committee members selected by the student. The student must register for the clinical science comprehensive by September 30 of Ph-D- Year 2. The Clinical Science Comprehensive Committee evaluates the final paper.

Lakehead University offers a Master of Arts degree in Clinical Psychology, a Master of Science degree in Psychological Science, and a Doctor of Philosophy in Psychology degree in the two fields of Clinical Psychology and Psychological Science.

The Psychology PhD in the Clinical Psychology field is CPA-accredited. The masters degrees normally requires two years of full-time study. The PhD degrees normally requires ~~3~~ **three** years of full-time study, with the Psychology PhD in the Clinical Psychology field taking an additional year of full-time study for the predoctoral internship, **resulting in up to a maximum of up to five 5** years. Both the Clinical MA and PhD Psychology programs employ the scientist-practitioner model of training. The objective of the Clinical MA program is to prepare students for doctoral-level

researchers. The PhD program in the Clinical Psychology field also has an additional focus on rural, community, and cultural issues. The PhD program in the Psychological Science field is a research-intensive program in all areas of psychology including biological, cognitive, individual and social bases of behaviour. The Psychological Science graduate curriculum is based on an apprenticeship model with flexible core courses that are appropriate to a student's research area of focus.

Students are trained in clinical and research skills that allow them to pursue a career in professional practice that is informed by science or in academic/research settings that require highly trained clinical psychology researchers. The PhD program in the Clinical Psychology field also has an additional focus on rural, community, and cultural issues.

The PhD program in the Psychological Science field is a research-intensive program in all areas of psychology including biological, cognitive, individual and social bases of behaviour. **The masters degree in Psychological Science normally requires two years of full-time study and the PhD in the Psychological Science field normally requires three years of full-time study, up to a maximum of four years.** The Psychological Science graduate curriculum is based on an apprenticeship model with flexible core courses that are appropriate to a student's research area of focus.

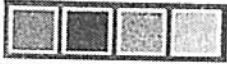
