Emphasis given to the distribution and use of a variety of resources, problems of resource and environmental management, the need for integrative and interdisciplinary approaches as well as critical but constructive approaches to problem solving in resource management, and how to deal with uncertainty.	A focus on resource management from ecological, economic, social/behavioural and institutional/decision-making perspectives. Emphasis is given to the distribution and use of a variety of resources, problems of resource and environmental management, the need for integrative and interdisciplinary approaches as well as critical but constructive approaches to problem solving in resource management, and how to deal with uncertainty conflicts between economic growth (i.e. often from resource exploitation) and resource sustainability. The course also emphasizes the ecological limits of renewable resources and what resources depletion means for future generations. Opportunities for achieving sustainable resource use, especially here in Canada, are discussed.
