	In addition to the written report, Dr. McPherson highlighted the recent Vice-President, External Relations appointment.
	The President and Vice-Chancellor updated the Senate on the Ontario government's recent announcement regarding proposed legislation to establish the Northern Ontario School of Medicine as an independent, standalone degree-granting institution. Dr. McPherson also provided an overview on communication regarding this matter and remaining uncertainties. Discussion ensued regarding the following topics:

- CCAA proceedings
- potential implications
- relationship agreement
- establishment of NOSM
- unprecedented government intervention into university governance structures
- Postsecondary Education Quality Assessment Board application
- advocacy strategies
- potential Senate motion to indicate that the unilateral decision made by the government is not supported

The Senior Associate Dean of NOSM indicated that NOSM values its relationship with both Universities and whatever the outcome is, NOSM is going to want to continue a relationship with Lakehead University.

The President noted that neither the government or NOSM sought Lakehead University's input on any proposed changes to NOSM's relationship with Lakehead University.

MOVED (D. Kerr) that the Senate of Lakehead University condemns, in the strongest possible terms, the legislation tabled by the Province of Ontario to sever NOSM from Lakehead University. CARRIED

Further discussion ensued regarding the proposed legislation.

Dr. McPherson emphasized the importance of the Senate's support and encouraged Senators to advocate for Lakehead University on this matter, wherever possible.
