For the NTEP General BA, BEd and BA, BSc, at the P/J and J/I levels, we included 3 Indigenous Learning courses to incorporate more Native content into these programs. IL 1100, an introductory course in Indigenous Learning, is an important introduction to Indigenous peoples' contemporary issues and historical contexts.

Previously, Education 3235 and 3270 were required, but now we have additional Aboriginal-focused courses that students may choose and these are included in the slate of Aboriginal-focused courses.

The Honours BA, B.Ed (Indigenous Learning) will now be treated the same as other Honours BA, BEd programs, and we are aligning the Calendar to reflect that change. We are, however, recommending that students in Indigenous Learning, choose, wherever possible, education electives that are also Aboriginal-focused.
