Description of the Proposed Calendar Change:

On behalf of the Department of Music, I would like to propose the following calendar changes (to take effect in the 2009-10 academic year):

1) Creation of Music 2337 and Music 3337 (Opera Studio). Course Descriptions:

Music 2337 (Opera Studio I): Rehearsals 2 hours per week for 24 weeks, and performances. Opera Studio is intended to give students general experience in all aspects of opera production. This program will cover topics in staging, movement, dance, and vocal performance styles. This course is open to students in the H.B.Mus. and H.B.A. (Music) programs, and others who have passed a competitive audition.

Music 3337 (Opera Studio II): Prerequisite: Music 2337 or permission of the Department. Continuation of Music 2337.

2) Creation of Music 4915 (Music Criticism). Course Description:

Music 4915 (Music Criticism): A study of the history, theory, and practice of Music Criticism. As part of the practical component of the course, students will compile a dossier of critical reviews of musical events and recordings.

3) Changing Music 3381 (Conducting) from one full course to two half courses (Music 3371 and 3372). Course Descriptions:

Music 3371 (Conducting I): Open to non-Music majors by permission of the Department. The study of basic conducting techniques and performance practices is integrated with a general historical survey of choral and orchestral music from the Middle Ages to the Twentieth Century. This course includes listening and discussing, and emphasizes the development of conducting techniques.

Music 3372 (Conducting II) Pre-requisite: Music 3371 or permission of the Department. Continuation of Music 3371. The study of advanced conducting techniques and rehearsal strategies.

4) Adding an additional year level to Music 2336-3336 (Chamber Choir).

Course Description:

Music 4336 (Chamber Choir III): Rehearsals 2 hours weekly for 24 weeks, plus performances. Pre-requisites: Music 3336 or permission of the Department. Continuation of Music 3336.

5) Modification of the Program Requirements for the Third Year of the H.B.Mus. and H.B.A. (Music) programs pertaining to Music Literature courses, as detailed in Section 2 below.

*Please note that the changes outlined in Items 2 and 3 above will necessitate minor modifications to the Third Year and Fourth Year Program Requirements for students in the H.B.Mus. and H.B.A. (Music) programs, as detailed in Section 2 below.

Dr. G. Colton Chair, Department of Music Rationale of the Proposed Calendar Change(s): (Corresponding to Section 2 where required)

1

A course in Opera Studio has been offered for the past two years as a Topics course (Music 3313). Assigning the course its own number will allow for it to be offered in future years, while allowing other Topics courses to utilize the 3313 number. Consistent with the numbering assigned to other music ensembles courses, there are two year levels (2337 and 3337) so that students may participate in opera studies in more than one year. This course may be taken as a music elective by students in the H.B.Mus. or H.B.A. (Music) programs, or by other students with permission of the Department. Budgetary implications: none.

2

This course has been offered several times as a Topics course (Music 4315). As with 1) above, assigning this course its own number will allow other Topics course to utilize the 4315 number. This course may be taken in partial fulfillment of the requirements for the H.B.Mus. or H.B.A. (Music) programs, or by other students with permission of the Department. Budgetary implications: none.

3

At present, students must complete this course in consecutive terms during the Fall/Winter period. Splitting them into sequential half courses will allow students the flexibility to choose whether to take them in consecutive terms OR in different academic years. Both half courses will remain required courses for students in the H.B.Mus. and H.B.A. (Music) programs. Budgetary implications: none.

4

The new course number (Music 4336) will enable students to continue participating in the Chamber Choir for more than two years. As with Music 2336-3336, this course may be taken as a music elective for students in the H.B.Mus. or H.B.A. (Music) programs, or by other students with permission of the Department. Budgetary implications: none.

5

The Department has long recognized the importance of Music Literature courses to students' musical training. Due to declining enrolment in some of these courses, it was decided that the wording "recommended" was not sufficient.
