### Description of the Proposed Calendar Change:

A unique opportunity exists at Lakehead University for students enrolling in the Centre for Northern Studies' Interdisciplinary Northern Studies Program. Students can achieve an Honours Bachelor of Arts, an Honours Bachelor of Science, or a Minor in Northern Studies. In addition, students can fulfill requirements for the University of the Arctic's Bachelor of Circumpolar Studies. Lakehead University is known internationally as one of the main centres for northern studies in Canada. Our activities in this area have added a distinct dimension to Lakehead's identity as a university "of the North, in the North." By making a significant commitment and investment in the late 1980s, the University laid the foundation for its present high standing among Northernists.

Over four years you will have the opportunity to take a variety of courses from several offerings in the following disciplines: Anthropology, Biology, Chemistry, Economics, Environmental Studies, Forestry, Geography, Geology, History, Indigenous Learning, Outdoor Parks and Recreation, Political Science, Social Work, Sociology, and Forestry. Distinctive elements of our programs are our partnerships with international organizations such as the University of the Arctic. A vital, and unique, component in the support structure for Northern Studies at Lakehead is the Northern Studies Resource Centre in the Chancellor Paterson Library, developed to be the prime location of relevant resources and data on Northwestern Ontario, the Provincial Norths and the circumpolar world. This is a major community and regional resource with access available to all groups and individuals. Staff in the centre provide a range of services both to the university and to the regional community, including tours of the centre and provision of information on the available resources for northern studies.

A degree in Northern Studies will help prepare students for a variety of public and private sector professional opportunities dealing with local, national, and international environmental issues. Graduates of Northern Studies can expect to find work in northern related agencies of all levels of government: federal, provincial and local. Employment opportunities also exist in northern economic development, social service agencies, resource management, resource exploration and development companies, environmental nongovernmental organizations, northern park management, conservation, journalism, education and health.
