**DATE:** January 14, 2009

The Senate Budget Committee met three times since the last Senate meeting, on Dec 12<sup>th</sup> and Dec 15<sup>th</sup>, 2008 and on January 9<sup>th</sup>, 2009 in an attempt to process the large number of items before the Committee. Admissions and Recruitment to ensure that the program receives funding as a 4-year honours program, and 2) it is understood that staffing needs for this program will be subject to budgetary approval. Providing consistent and timely advice to potential students, especially transfer students, will ensure recruitment, retention and financial sustainability of the program. *Carried*.
