Description of the Proposed Calendar Change:
Addition of Majors to HBASc

Rationale of the Proposed Calendar Change(s):
(Corresponding to Section 2 where required)

In order to increase enrolment and compete against neighbouring universities in Southern Ontario, Lakehead--Orillia needs to be able to offer degrees with majors. It is proposed that Orillia offer full majors in the following disciplines, all of which have seen healthy growth in enrolment so far: Anthropology, English, and Geography. The disciplinary requirements for each of these majors will be identical to existing disciplinary requirements in HBA or HBSc programs. The elective and area requirements will follow Orillia HBASc patterns, ensuring adequate representation from both Arts and Science.

PROGRAM REGULATIONS

Credits for courses taken outside the Faculty of Science and Environmental Studies, or Faculty of Social Science and Humanities, and for concurrent students also the Faculty of Education, or Lakehead University, must be approved by the Registrar in consultation with the Dean of Science and Environmental Studies, Dean of Social Science and Humanities, and for concurrent students also by the Dean of the Faculty of Education, or in each case, the Deans' designate.

1. A student who successfully completes the courses as indicated in his/her program of study will have his/her year level incremented as follows:

Year 1 = < 4 full course equivalents

Year 2 = 4 to < 9 full course equivalents

Year 3 = 9 to < 14 full course equivalents

Year 4 = 14 >

2. Students in the HBASc: Multidisciplinary Studies are required to satisfactorily complete

PROGRAM REGULATIONS

1. Students in the HBASc (Interdisciplinary Studies) are required to satisfactorily complete a minimum of two disciplinary specializations (a specialization comprises a set of 5 FCE in a discipline). These specializations must be identified by the student prior to entering the third year of the program. Changes in specialization after the third year require the permission of the Campus Dean.

2. A specialization comprises a minimum of five FCE (full course equivalent) courses from a discipline in Area I or II. Students should consult with an academic advisor as to which disciplines are most suitable as areas of specialization.

3. Students in the HBASc disciplinary major programs are required to satisfactorily complete a major in one of the following disciplines:

a minimum of two disciplinary specializations (a specialization comprises a set of 5 FCE in a discipline), and these specializations must be identified by the student.

3. A disciplinary specialization comprises a minimum of five FCE (full course equivalent) courses. In the case of a student emphasizing Social Science and Humanities, the two specializations would be drawn from the following Social Science and Humanities disciplines subject to the availability of courses: (Social Science - Economics, Political Science, Psychology, Sociology, Women's Studies; Humanities - English, History, Indigenous Learning, Languages, Music, Philosophy, Religious Studies, Visual Art, Women's Studies). In the case of a student emphasizing Science and Environmental Studies, the two would be drawn from the following Science and Environmental Studies disciplines, subject to availability of courses (Anthropology, Biology, Chemistry, Computer Science, Geography, Geology, Mathematics, Physics), or with permission of the Dean and Program Chair, from approved interdepartmental studies programs such as the Water Resource Science, Environmental Studies, or the Applied Bio-Molecular Science Programs. Students in the concurrent BASc/BEEd would complete 1 disciplinary specialization and three FCE in a secondary discipline.

4. A maximum of seven (7) FCE first year or zero level courses may be satisfactorily completed and counted towards the HBASc or BASc degrees.

5. At least five (5) FCE courses must be satisfactorily completed at the third year level or above for the HBASc: Multidisciplinary Studies.

6. At least three (3) FCE elective courses should be satisfactorily completed in the other faculty; that is, a student choosing two specializations in the Faculty of Science and Environmental Studies must satisfactorily complete at least 3 FCE in the faculty of Social Sciences and Humanities, with at least 1 FCE from the Humanities and 1 FCE from the Social Sciences; a student choosing two specializations in the Faculty of Social Sciences and Humanities must satisfactorily complete at least 3 FCE in the Faculty of Science and Environmental Studies, with at least 1 FCE in Science and 1 FCE in Environmental Studies. Students in a concurrent program must satisfactorily complete at least 2 FCEs in Education prior to the professional year and one FCE in either visual arts or music as well as one FCE in

Anthropology, English, or Geography (a major comprises a set of 10 FCE in a discipline, including several core requirements). Majors must be identified by students prior to entering the third year of each program. Changes in program after the third year require the permission of the Campus Dean.

4. To meet interdisciplinary requirements for the HBASc, a student choosing two specializations in Area I (Arts and Social Sciences) must satisfactorily complete at least 3 FCE in Area II (Sciences, Environmental Studies). Alternatively, a student choosing two specializations in Area II must satisfactorily complete at least 3 FCE in Area I.

5. All students in 3-5 year programs at the Orillia campus will satisfactorily complete a required 1 FCE in first year Inquiry.

6. All students in the HBASc will satisfactorily complete a required 1 FCE course in fourth year Inquiry. Note: Inquiry 4010/4030 is restricted to students in the HBASc or HBASc, BEd programs.

7. Additional FCE electives must be selected from Area I or Area II.

8. Two FCE "Open Electives" may be taken from any faculty (practicum, clinical and co-op credits are not eligible). Students should consult with an academic advisor prior to making their course selection in this category. In the case of the concurrent Education programs, the two "open electives" are specified as Education courses, but for students in the HBASc, courses from any of the professional disciplines (Area III) may be eligible.

9. A maximum of seven (7) FCE first year or zero level courses may be satisfactorily completed and counted towards the HBASc or BASc degrees.

10. At least five (5) FCE courses must be satisfactorily completed at the third year level or above for the HBASc (Interdisciplinary Studies).

11. The last five (5) FCE courses must be taken while registered in the HBASc or BASc programs except with permission of the Chair of Interdisciplinary Studies. For students in concurrent Education programs, the last 5.5 FCEs constitute studies in the Professional Year.

7. All students in the HBASc or HBASc/BEEd will satisfactorily complete a required 1 FCE first year course in inquiry: Multidisciplinary Studies, Inquiry I (ST); and a capstone 1 FCE course Multidisciplinary Studies, Inquiry II (ST) in year 4. Note that Inquiry II is restricted to students in the HBASc or HBASc/BEEd programs.

8. Three additional FCE electives may be selected from either the Faculty of Social Science and Humanities, or the Faculty of Science and Environmental Studies.

9. *Two FCE "Open Electives" may be taken from any faculty (practicum, clinical and co-op credits are not eligible). Students should consult with the Program Coordinator prior to making their course selection in this category. In the case of the concurrent education programs, the two "open electives" are specified as Education courses, but for students in the HBASc, courses from any of the professional disciplines (Group D) may be eligible.

10. The last five (5) FCE courses must be taken while registered in the HBASc: Multidisciplinary Studies or the BASc: Multidisciplinary Studies except with permission of the appropriate Dean(s) or the Program Coordinator. For students in the concurrent programs, the last five courses usually comprise the professional year.

11. Students are advised to discuss the selection of course(s) with the Program Coordinator in order to determine whether or not the course is the best choice in light of the student's plans for the future. Also, students should check to see that they have sufficient background in the subject matter to enroll in the course.

12. An HBASc or HBASc/BEEd student who has not met the requirement of a cumulative B average (70%) may be permitted, with reasonable expectation of success and with the approval of the Dean or Dean's designate concerned, to proceed on probation into the succeeding year of his/her program. Should he/she fail to obtain the required average a second time, he/she must apply to transfer to another program. The student may also request evaluation for a transfer to the BASc or if registered in the HBASc/BEEd program, to the concurrent BASc/BEEd program at this time. Admission to the BASc or in the circumstances described in this regulation, to the BASc/BEEd may only be permitted with special permission of the Deans or their designates.

13. To graduate with the HBASc or to enter

12. An HBASc student who has not met the requirement of a cumulative B average (70%) may be permitted, with reasonable expectation of success and with the approval of the Chair of Interdisciplinary Studies, to proceed on probation into the succeeding year of his/her program. Should he/she fail to obtain the required average a second time, he/she must apply to transfer to another program. Admission to the BASc may only be permitted with special permission of the Orillia Campus Dean or Dean's designate.

13. To graduate with the HBASc (Interdisciplinary Studies) or to enter the professional year of the HBASc/BEEd, students must have a minimum cumulative grade average of 70%. To graduate with an HBASc disciplinary major, students must have a minimum grade average of 70% in courses pertaining to that major. To graduate from the BASc, a student must have a minimum cumulative grade average of 60%. The exit average for the BABSc/BEEd is 65% in the Professional Year (see 3b, Calendar, p. 68).




