

Alberto Costi is a Professor of Law at Te Herenga Waka—Victoria University of Wellington, where he also serves as Associate Dean (Academic Programmes) and Co-Director of the New Zealand Centre of International Economic Law. He holds an LLB from the Université de Montréal, a Diploma of Advanced European Legal Studies from the College of Europe in Bruges, and an LLM from Harvard Law School, providing him with a broad, multi-jurisdictional academic foundation. His expertise in international and comparative law has been honed through extensive teaching, research, and leadership roles across Canada, the United States, the United Kingdom, Europe, Australasia, and the Asia-Pacific region. His career reflects a commitment to curriculum innovation and transformative legal education, having been involved with the development of specialised and multidisciplinary programs and initiatives that integrate indigenous perspectives into legal training.

In addition to his academic and administrative roles, Alberto has made significant contributions to legal scholarship and practice. With over ninety publications—including book chapters, and peer-reviewed articles—he has established himself as a leading voice in international law, environmental law, and human rights. His leadership extends to key positions within various legal and academic associations, such as serving as General Editor of New Zealand's first-ever textbook on international law, acting as Secretary-General of the International Law Association New Zealand Branch, and serving on the World Commission on Environmental Law of the International Union for the Conservation of Nature (IUCN). Known for his collaborative approach, he has successfully united academia, government, and industry to advance legal scholarship and practice through conferences and other events.
