

Douglas Ivison is an Associate Professor in the Department of English at Lakehead University's Thunder Bay campus, where he teaches Canadian literature, popular fiction, science fiction, and climate-change narratives. Doug is the editor of *Canadian Fantasy and Science-Fiction Writers* (Gale, 2002) and co-editor (with Justin D. Edwards) of *Downtown Canada: Writing Canadian Cities* (UTP, 2005), and has published articles in peer-reviewed books and journals, including *English Studies in Canada*, *Studies in Canadian Literature*, and *Canadian Literature*. His current research is focused on climate change in literary and cultural texts, urbanism in Canadian literature and culture, and race and gender in popular television. Doug has served on the Advisory Board of *Studies in Canadian Literature* since 2003, and has served on the executives of the Association for Canadian and Québec Literatures (ACQL) and Association of Canadian College and University Teachers of English (ACCUTE). He is currently the President of ACCUTE. Doug served as Graduate Coordinator of the English MA program (2005-2009) and Chair of the English Department (2011-2016 & 2019-2022), has chaired three Senate committees and served on numerous committees at Lakehead, and has been Lakehead's Academic Colleague on the Council of Ontario Universities since 2018. He is also a member of the graduate programs in Gender and Women's Studies and Social Justice Studies.
