Research & Innovation Week 2025: Celebrating 20 Years of Excellence



Lakehead University celebrated its 20th annual Research & Innovation Week from February 24–28 in Thunder Bay, bringing together faculty, students, industry partners, and the broader community to showcase research excellence and foster collaboration.

A highlight of the event was keynote speaker **Jill Heinerth**, Explorer-in-Residence at The Royal Canadian Canad

Canadian Geographical Society. In her talk, "Explorations in Excellence," Heinerth shared insights from her groundbreaking cave diving explorations, emphasizing curiosity, resilience, and the role of innovation in pushing scientific boundaries



The milestone year began with the **Science Carnival**, a free public event in partnership with Science North at the Intercity Shopping Centre, attracting **3,800 visitors** who engaged in hands-on science demonstrations and exhibits. Throughout the week, over **30 public lectures**, **interactive exhibits**, **and research workshops** took place, featuring topics such as health promotion, aging in place, Indigenous research, and Al knowledge mobilization.

A key focus was student research, with **52 undergraduate and 65 graduate students** presenting at research conferences and poster competitions. Standout achievements included **Dylan Di Carlo** (Anthropology) winning the **Three-Minute Thesis (3MT®) competition** and **Alexandra Haak** (Forestry) becoming a finalist in the **GRADflix competition**.

The week concluded with the Research & Innovation Awards of Excellence, celebrating exceptional contributions. Dr. Christopher Mushquash (Psychology) and Dr. Sandra Jeppesen (Interdisciplinary Studies) received the Distinguished Researcher Award for their groundbreaking work in Indigenous mental health and alternative media studies, respectively. <u>Lakehead Researchers Appointed to UArctic Research Chairs (Feb. 25th 2025)</u>

Dr. Sudip Rakshit and Dr. Chris Southcott have been appointed international research chairs with the University of the Arctic (UArctic), focusing on sustainable development in the Circumpolar North.



• **Dr. Rakshit** will lead efforts in circular bioeconomy and sustainable biorefining processes, using marine and terrestrial resources to address environmental challenges in the Arctic.



• **Dr. Southcott** will focus on the impact of resource development on Arctic communities, working to empower them to have greater control and benefit from regional resource projects.

These prestigious appointments underscore Lakehead University's leadership in Arctic research and its commitment to sustainable development in northern regions.

A key highlight of the event was the announcement of a new five-year research partnership with Kinross Gold Corporation, focused on enhancing mineral exploration in the Red Lake Greenstone Belt in Northwestern Ontario. Appointment of Dr. Gillian Balfour as Provost, Vice-President Academic



Dr. Gillian Balfour will join Lakehead University as Provost and Vice-President, Academic on July 1, 2025. She brings extensive leadership experience from Thompson Rivers University, Western, and Trent, where she has successfully led strategic academic planning, budget oversight, and initiatives focused on equity, diversity, and inclusion.

With a PhD in sociology from the University of Manitoba, Dr. Balfour's research focuses on restorative justice and sentencing law reforms addressing the over-incarceration of Indigenous women. Her expertise in academic governance, student success, and innovative program development will be valuable as Lakehead advances major institutional priorities, including the Collaborative Doctor of Veterinary Medicine program, the Barrie STEM Hub, and the expansion of the Orillia campus.

Dr. Balfour has expressed enthusiasm about joining Lakehead, recognizing its strong reputation for student experience and research excellence. Her experience leading institutions through growth and change will be an asset as we navigate an evolving post-secondary landscape and work towards long-term financial sustainability.

I would also like to extend my gratitude to Dr. David Richards for his leadership as Interim Provost and Vice-President, Academic, ensuring continuity and progress during this transition

March Break Open Houses

Lakehead University recently hosted successful March Break Open Houses on both our Thunder Bay and Orillia campuses, welcoming a total of 551 guests (331 in Orillia and 220 in Thunder Bay). These events provided prospective students and their supporters with an opportunity to experience our campuses firsthand, engage with faculty and staff, and learn more about our academic programs and student services. Notably, over 55 students accepted their offers on the spot, a testament to the impact of these events on enrolment.

Chancellor Deverell Reappointed for a Second Term



Dr. Rita Shelton Deverell has accepted a second term as Chancellor of Lakehead University. Since her appointment in 2021, she has been a dedicated ambassador, supporting the university's mission, fostering outreach and philanthropy, and presiding over convocation ceremonies.

A pioneering broadcaster, journalist, theatre artist, and educator, Chancellor Deverell has broken barriers throughout her career, including as a co-founder of Vision TV and the first woman to lead a journalism program at a Canadian university. She has mentored and advanced the careers of Black, Indigenous, and People of Colour in Canada's arts and cultural industries.

A Member of the Order of Canada, she has received numerous accolades, including two Gemini Awards, the Governor General's Performing Arts Lifetime Achievement Award for Broadcasting, and ACTRA's "Woman of the Year." Her commitment to Truth and Reconciliation and advocacy for inclusivity align with Lakehead's values, and we look forward to her continued leadership.
