Lakehead Celebrates King Charles III Coronation Medal Recipients

We are proud to recognize several distinguished members of the Lakehead University community who were awarded the King Charles III Coronation Medal in March, and we expect a couple more employees to receive this noteworthy recognition in the weeks to come, as well. This prestigious honor, recognizing exceptional service, is the first Canadian commemorative medal issued for a coronation.

Thunder Bay—Superior North MP Patty Hajdu presented the medal to Lakehead faculty, staff, and alumni, including Pipe Major Lorne Clifford, Dr. Christopher Mushquash, Dr. Roopa Rakshit, Dr. Alla Reznik, and Dr. Michel S. Beaulieu. These individuals were honored for their outstanding contributions in areas such as mental health, community building, breast cancer detection, historical preservation, and fostering inclusivity.

- **Dr. Michel S. Beaulieu**: Celebrated for his contributions to preserving northern Ontario's history and supporting students.
