Lakehead researchers Dr. Martha Dowsley and Dr. Debra Mackinnon are conducting impactful, SSHRC-funded studies. Dr. Dowsley investigates cultural and economic relationships with plants in Indigenous and Nubian communities, aiming to strengthen food sovereignty and cultural resilience through a \$328,000 grant. Dr. Mackinnon examines the evolving role of Ontario public libraries in fostering safety and inclusivity amid societal challenges, supported by a \$97,267 grant. These projects reflect Lakehead University's dedication to sustainability, equity, and global knowledge advancement.

Honouring Indigenous Veterans: Lakehead University and Confederation College Host Commemorative Exhibits for Veterans' Week

In recognition of Veterans' Week, Lakehead University and Confederation College hosted exhibits honoring the contributions of Indigenous veterans from Northwestern Ontario. These displays, featuring photos and artifacts from the World Wars and peacekeeping missions, highlight the bravery and resilience of First Nations, Métis, and Inuit soldiers. Lakehead's exhibit focused on the Indigenous Veterans of Treaty #3, developed in collaboration with the Fort Frances Museum, Kay-Nah-Chi-Wah-Nung Historical Centre, and others, to commemorate the achievements and sacrifices of Indigenous veterans. Confederation College's exhibit, created with the Native Veterans Association of Northwestern Ontario, shared regional stories in the spirit of reconciliation and education.



Artifacts and photographs commemorating the important contributions of Indigenous veterans will be on display at Lakehead University and Confederation College from November 6 to 11.

Lakehead Researchers Secure \$1.4 Million in NSERC Funding for Pioneering Projects

Lakehead University researchers have received over \$1.4 million from the Natural Sciences and Engineering Research Council of Canada (NSERC) to support innovative studies across civil engineering, green chemistry, and autonomous systems. This funding enables projects that will contribute to sustainable infrastructure, eco-friendly materials, and efficient transportation solutions, underscoring Lakehead's role in technological and environmental advancements.

Key researchers include:

 Dr. Mohammed El-Gendy (Civil Engineering), awarded \$147,500 for work on climate-resilient concrete using fiber-reinforced polymers.



• Dr. Pedram Fatehi (Chemical Engineering), granted \$320,000 to develop lignin-based alternatives for the packaging and cosmetics industrie



 Dr. Xing Tan (Computer Science), awarded \$132,500 for research on algorithms for autonomous vehicle routing.



Additional Discovery Grants were awarded to Drs. Mitchell Albert, Ahmed Bediwy, Oleksandr Bubon, Philip Fralick, and Yurii Shepelytskyi. Dr. Christopher Murray received a PromoScience Grant for the Farm Lab project, supported by co-applicants Dr. Ellen Field and Jacob Kearey-Moreland

Lakehead University Receives \$560K for World's Largest Soil Testing Facility, Led by Engineering Professor Eltayeb Mohamedelhassan

Lakehead University has secured nearly \$560,000 in funding from the Northern Ontario Heritage Fund Corporation (NOHFC) to develop the world's largest soil testing facility. The project will be led by Dr. Eltayeb Mohamedelhassan, assistant dean and professor at the university's Faculty of Engineering. Dr. Mohamedelhassan explained that the facility would enable advanced research on soil strength, particularly for infrastructure projects like railways and deep mines.

The funding was announced by Kevin Holland, Member of Provincial Parliament (MPP) for Thunder Bay-Atikokan. Holland emphasized the importance of this project in helping regional industries, such as engineering and mining, by providing vital data on soil strength and load-bearing capacity.

The initiative reflects Lakehead University's commitment to innovation and industry partnerships, positioning it as a leader in advancing research that supports critical infrastructure development in Northwestern Ontario.
