Admission Requirements

Graduates from Georgian College's 3-year Environmental Technology (Co-op) diploma program, with a minimum overall "B" (70% or 3.0 GPA) average, may transfer into year 3 of the HBASc (Environmental Sustainability) program after completing one full-course equivalent in the spring/summer session prior to year 3.

Careers

Graduates of this program will be able to apply their skills in sectors such as agriculture, forestry, fisheries and wildlife, parks and conservation areas, mining, and energy, working in fields such as waste management, environmental restoration, air, water, and land quality, natural resources management, and ecotourism.

Interdisciplinary Studies major with specializations in Political Science, Psychology or Sociology

With your Arts and Science diploma, you will be able to continue expanding your knowledge in both the arts and sciences, while delving deeper into key specializations of your choice. The Interdisciplinary Studies program is flexible in its design, allowing you to customize your educational experience. As a college transfer student transitioning into the Interdisciplinary Studies major, you will choose two of the following specializations: Political Science, Psychology or Sociology.

Admission Requirements

Graduates from Georgian College's 2-year General Arts and Science (GAAS) diploma program, with a minimum overall "B" (70% or 3.0 GPA) average, may transfer into year three of either the HBASc (Interdisciplinary Studies) or BASc (Interdisciplinary Studies) programs after completing two full-course equivalents in the spring/summer session prior to year three.

Careers

The Interdisciplinary Studies degree at Lakehead prepares you to enter professions such as social work, law, journalism, and even medicine. You might also decide to go into teaching, politics, public relations, or career counselling.
