The course will focus on diversity and its importance to cultural and social development. In an increasingly interconnected world, all societies confront the challenge of interacting with cultures of different values, perspectives and world views. We will examine the functioning of diverse customs and traditions within the context of host communities and societies. We will try to gain a better understanding of the underlying connection between culture and diversity, as well as the role communities play in the development of national identity and global consciousness.

Reading Materials:

There is no specific textbook dedicated to the course. Students are encouraged to use variety of sources when working on assignments or presentations. Some articles and e-books from LU library could be assigned during the course.

Course Policies:

- 1. Attendance: It is very important that you make every effort to attend and participate in all scheduled classes.
- 2. Courtesy in Class: You are encouraged to ask and answer questions. However, all your questions and answers should be directed to the whole class as part of the class discussion.
