Course description:

An overview of Old and New World archaeology, with particular emphasis on the development of humans and culture from hunting/gathering to agricultural and ancient urban societies in Mesoamerica, Europe, Egypt, Mesopotamia, the Indus Valley, and China.

Grading:

- Written assignment (10-12 pages double spaced, not including figures or references): **30%**
 - A written report describing, and discussing, the archaeological significance of any recent (last 5-10 years) archaeological using peer-reviewed resources (journal articles and/or academic books). Evaluation will focus on the quality of your writing, the depth of your research (minimum 10 peer-reviewed sources), organization, and other criteria. Follow the APA style guide for formatting your paper.
 - Due date: April 13, 2021
- Midterm exam: **30%**
 - Format to be determined, but will likely comprise multiple choice questions
 - Online only (through D2L)
 - Test questions will be derived from the lecture material and required textbook
 - "Open-book", with a time limit

- Final exam: 40%
