Course Description:

Advanced concepts and knowledge in the field of paleoanthropology are examined in this course through a detailed examination of the enigmatic extinct species *Homo floresiensis*. Topics will surround the morphological, archaeological, and genetic evidence for human evolution and the implications for understanding human diversity during the past and present.
