Aboriginal Initiatives

Administration

A Work Study position has begun in the Vice Provost (Aboriginal Initiatives) office to work with the Northwestern Coordinated Learning Access Network (CLAN) and the development of a Canadian Roots Exchange office and program at Lakehead. Two Confederation College practicum students will also be working with the Work Study. These students will be responsible for building a strong foundation and preparing guidelines for the Lakehead Canadian Roots Exchange Program and assisting with the coordination of the Lakehead Pow Wow.

Faculty of Natural Resources Management

NRM hosted an evening Town Hall meeting in November with the launch of Borealforum.com (a platform to have an open and constructive conversation on sustainable forest management in Ontario's boreal forest). The event (and forum) led by the Resolute Forest Products' Montreal-based Richard Garneau (President and CEO) was well attended (300+) and included many controversial topics connected to forest management in the boreal forest – such as caribou strategies, First Nations consultation, regional economic sustainability, certification, eNGOs, etc. The event was covered by both CBC and the local newspaper and led to a healthy debate both on campus and in the local media.

In November 2014, Dr. U. Runesson, Dr. C. Shahi, Dr. M. Leitch and Mr. A. Bilyk travelled to India with the goal of strengthening collaborations with a number of universities and research organizations for student and faculty exchanges, joint research and opportunities for student internships. Specifically, NRM took part in Chitkara University's Global Engineering Week celebration where one-week courses were offered on *Remote Sensing, Drones* and *Research Initiatives on Sustainable Development* to engineering and agriculture students – over 300 students participated. As part of these activities a number of actual field drone demonstrations were conducted. The NRM team also acted as judges for an engineering student competition for quad copter design and flight management.

At Lovely Professional University (LPU) Dr. Runesson delivered a keynote address dealing with institutional remote sensing challenges at an International Conference on "Exploring Basic and Applied Sciences". The NRM team also performed various ceremonial tasks at the conference, which was inaugurated by the Governor of South Carolina State and closed by the Governor of Punjab State. The LPU visit also included a number of actual field drone demonstrations to engineering and biology/agricultural students.

During the Chitkara and LPU visits (both in the Punjab Region) the NRM team also had individual meetings with the academic leaderships related to the establishment of near-future 3+1 and 2+2 student mobility arrangements as well as the establishment of internship projects.

The NRM team also visited Amity University in Dehli with the intent of setting up an internship program and a renewal of our past MOU for student exchange.

The India visit concluded with a visit to the Institute of Wood Science and Technology further south in Bangalore where Dr. Leitch gave a keynote address on how Lakehead is advancing with various "India-relevant" wood technologies. This visit also included focussed discussions towards a near future MOU with the Indian Institute of Science.
