#### **Undergraduate Recruitment**

# Student Accessibility Services

Student Accessibility Services in Thunder Bay accommodated 946 tests during the winter term - an increase from 846 in 2013/14.

To date the overall number of students registered with both Thunder Bay and Orillia Student Accessibility Services has increased from 550 in the last academic year to 597, an 8.5% increase.

Student Accessibility Services continues to meet with students who may require academic accommodations during the last part of the term.

#### Student Success Centre

The Student Success Centre has interviewed and welcomed 25 students to the newly relaunched **Student Ambassador Program**. A *Welcome Reception* was held on April 1, which included training on ambassador expectations, icebreakers and programming brainstorming sessions. The program is designed to build a strong pool of enthusiastic and engaged student volunteers who want to support and contribute back to the Lakehead Community.

# Aboriginal Initiatives

#### Aboriginal Cultural & Support Services (ACSS)

ACSS continues to host regular events and has implemented the Elders Circle sessions bringing in eight Elders and twenty children for storytelling, craftwork, and lunch. The next session will be in June with the Elders and youth and will be about expressing voice. This will be tied to the very successful Toastmasters program.

## **Aboriginal Student Recruitment**

Preview days are in the process of being developed and promoted. Last year, more Aboriginal students attended than ever before and it is expected that there will be substantial numbers attending from across Thunder Bay as a result of regular outreach and recruitment activities.

### Native Access Program (NAP)

Entry into the Access Program has grown and for the first time the intake was 34 students at the beginning of the 2014-2015 academic year. There will be 20 students graduating and 17 of these graduates will be going into degree programs. The program is being developed to meet the needs and create a challenging opportunity for Aboriginal youth.
