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A. CURRICULUM/CALENDAR CHANGES REFERRED FROM SENATE MEETING #3-2014 OF MARCH 17, 2014, ITEM 4 (2014-2015)

The Senate Undergraduate Studies Committee met on September 23, 2014 to review additional revisions to the proposal that was referred from the March 17, 2014 Senate meeting and previously reported in the Committee’s report, Part 1, to the May 15, 2014 Senate meeting. The Committee makes the following additional curriculum recommendations for the 2014-2015 Calendar:

(c) Women’s Studies – Clarification of List of Core Courses

The Committee recommends approval of the additional proposed revisions to the Women’s Studies course groups, as indicated in the hand-written revisions in the attached pdf document.
