I will be using the iClicker student response system in class. iClicker helps me understand what you know and gives everyone a chance to participate in class. Instructions and Information for iClicker

I will be using the iClicker Cloud classroom polling system in order to make our class time more engaging. This will help me understand what you know, give everyone a chance to participate, and increase how much you learn when we are in class together. This will also provide you with feedback on how well you are comprehending course concepts, help you master challenging concept, and allow you to review material after class.

Participating in my iClicker Cloud sessions will be counted towards your final grade. You will earn 0.3 points for submitting a response and an additional 0.7 points for a correct response; this makes 1 point for each correct question you answer. Likely, 3 - 5 questions will be asked in each lecture period. Your final iClicker grade will be calculated as (points earned) / (total possible points for the class) x 100.

To account for times when you miss class, forget your device etc, the two iClicker session with the lowest grade will be dropped. You should not expect any additional accommodations for missed iClcker sessions.

You are required to bring a device to participate in my iClicker Cloud sessions during class. I will be allowing participation with the iClicker Reef app on a smartphone, tablet or laptop OR iClicker remotes. It is your responsibility to set up your iClicker Reef account and/or iClicker remote in a timely fashion and follow the steps below to properly register in my iClicker course. It is also your responsibility to regularly check your iClicker records for any discrepancies and bring them to my attention within 48 hours.

In order to participate in my iClicker Cloud sessions and ensure that your grades are properly reflected in the gradebook, follow the steps below:

1. If you do not already have an iClicker Reef account, create one. It's free to create an account!

- You can do this by downloading and opening the iClicker Reef mobile app via the App Store or Google Play, or by visiting <u>iclicker.com</u>. If you already have an account, DO NOT create a new one; just proceed to step 2.
- If you are using an iClicker remote, you still need to have an iClicker Reef account.

2. Add my iClicker Cloud course to your iClicker Reef account, even if you are participating with an iClicker Remote.

- Use the + sign to search for my course in iClicker Reef.
- In the "Find Your Institution" field, enter Lakehead University-Thunder Bay
- In the "Find Your Course" field, enter BIOL 3770 FA/FAO Biology of Food Safety
- Ensure you select this course:
 - Biology of Food Safety
 - Heidi Schraft
 - o BIOL 3770FA / FAO, Fall 2019
- Click "Add This Course" and it will be added to the main screen of your iClicker Reef account

3. Set up the device you plan to use in class to participate in my sessions

- You can download the iClicker Reef mobile app via the App Store or Google Play, or you can use iClicker Reef on your laptop at iclicker.com.
 - o Connect to the classroom's wifi or use your cellular service
 - The recommended wifi is Lakehead University
 - If you have trouble connecting to this wifi, please go to the TSC helpdesk
- In order to use an iClicker remote in my class, you still need an iClicker Reef account. Once your
 account is created, add your iClicker remote ID number to the profile section of your iClicker Reef
 account. This will ensure your clicker responses show up in your iClicker Reef account and in my
 gradebook. Make sure you bring your remote with you to every class

4. Purchase an iClicker Reef subscription or enter an access code in order to participate in polling using iClicker Reef.

- Upon signing up with iClicker Reef, you will have a two week free-trial period for using the app for polling in class. Before the free trial ends, you need to purchase an iClicker Reef subscription or obtain an access code in order to continue participating with iClicker Reef on your mobile device, tablet, or laptop during polling sessions. iClicker Reef will let you know when your free trial has ended. If your free trial ends without completing this step, you will be unable to participate in polls until you purchase a subscription or enter an access code.
- If you are using an iClicker remote only, you don't need to buy access to iClicker Reef! Just
 make sure you add your iClicker remote ID number to the profile section of your iClicker Reef
 account.

5. Now the fun part! Participate in my sessions during each class.

- *iClicker Reef:* Each time our class meets, make sure you have selected my course from the main screen of your iClicker Reef account.
 - When I start a session, click the **Join** button that appears on your screen, then answer each question I ask in iClicker Reef.
 - o For short answer and numeric questions, make sure you press **Send**.
- If you are using an *iClicker remote*, make sure your remote frequency is set to AA.
 - When I ask a question, use your remote to respond.
 - For short answer and numeric questions, make sure you click **Send** after punching in your answer.

6. Keep track of your attendance, review your work, and study after class in iClicker Reef, even if you are using an iClicker remote to participate.

- You can review your grades, performance, and participation in iClicker Reef
- You can use the questions I asked during class as flashcards or practice tests in the <u>Study Tools</u> section of iClicker Reef.

Academic Integrity Information
