Course Description and Learning Outcomes

Course Description

A discussion of the intersections of gender, crime, and the criminal justice system. Specific topics could include: gender correlates of crime and victimization, gendered violence, masculinity and crime, and gendered experiences within criminal justice processes.

Credit Weight: 0.5

Learning outcomes

At the end of the course students should be able to:

- 1. List and explain key theoretical perspectives, concepts, and terminology used to understand how gender shapes our understanding of crime.
- 2. Recognize and describe how gender is central to the equality and equity of victimization experiences as well as the administration and outcomes of the criminal justice system.
- 3. Identify and describe the structures of the criminal justice system and the experiences of workers in relation to gender perspectives.
- 4. Apply facts and theories to critically analyze practical issues related to identify intersections (e.g., gender, race, class, and sexual orientation), crime and the criminal justice system within contexts of social inequality.
