## Lakehead Orillia Hosts the Universidad Popular Autónoma del Estado de Puebla

In June 2019, the Faculty of Business Administration and Lakehead International hosted students from The Universidad Popular Autónoma del Estado de Puebla (UPAEP) at the Orillia campus. Students completed a Lakehead Global Business Management Program over four weeks while experiencing Lakehead hospitality and the Canadian summer.

# Two Master of Science in Management student projects presented in Edinburgh

The prestigious 22<sup>nd</sup> World Marketing Congress organized by the Academy of Marketing Science was held in Edinburgh, Scotland between July 10<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup>, 2019. The congress program contained more than 270 presentations from participants representing more than 60 countries, and the master's project of two of our business graduates were presented at the congress.

Zachary Lepage developed a project on entomophagy (the use of insects by humans as a source of food) supervised by Drs. Claudio Pousa and Farshid Shams. The project analyzes how consumers develop value perceptions (attitudes) of entomophagy and eventually, intentions to consume (behaviours).

The other student, Yunling Liu, researched the impact of managerial coaching on salesperson relationship behaviours and performance, supervised by Drs. Claudio Pousa and Asad Aman. Her project tests the effect of a relational managerial behaviour (i.e. managerial coaching) on salesperson's performance and the mediating effect of relational behaviours (i.e. consumer orientation and adaptive selling) in a Chinese environment.

Both presentations will be published in the congress' proceedings.

#### **CAAA Conference in Ottawa, Ontario**

his Spring, the Canadian Academic Accounting Association (CAAA) held its annual conference in Ottawa, ON. This year's conference theme was "Mind the GA(A)P" which was a tongue in cheek way to bring attention and create a platform to find ways to "bridge the gaps" between the accounting profession and academia. Lakehead University's very own Dr. Camillo Lento and Dr. Naqi Sayed served as the conference co-chairs and stated in their welcome message that "bridging these gaps is more important now than ever before, considering all of the disruptive forces facing our profession." When asked to expand on what disruptive forces were facing the Accounting profession, they jointly explained that there are, "many disruptive forces

currently impacting the accounting profession. In general, the forces are technological, sociological, environmental and economical. Artificial intelligence, sustainable business practices, secure record-keeping technology, availability of big data and environmental concerns are just a few specific examples of these forces. Overall, the accounting profession and the business profession in which accountants operate are expected to be reshaped in the near future."

Lakehead University's Faculty of Business Administration is proud to have offered a Graduate Degree in Accounting, since September 2017, available at the Thunder Bay campus, and assisting students in being a part of the future of accounting.

As Trung tells us, "TOEIC is the most essential English certification in Vietnam, as most companies require candidates to achieve a certain TOEIC score in order to apply for work or maintain their positions." The main goal of his business was to provide an effective English learning experience for the students and help them improve their communication confidence. Trung managed this company for four years, growing from a team of 5 to over 20 people. Also, he was concurrently a moderator of the biggest TOEIC learning community on Facebook with a membership of over 400,000 users.



#### **ENACTUS CLUB**

he Enactus Lakehead group has been operational for the last three years and has showcased the amazing talent of our students. This year they competed at the Enactus Canada National Exposition in Vancouver along with 68 other Canadian universities and colleges. Enactus Lakehead presented two projects (Making Cents and Getting Financially Lit) in a dynamic 17-minute presentation and won Runner-Up in their league in the Opening Round.

Enactus Lakehead Projects & Their Impact:

- Making Cents! This addressed the closing of brick-and-mortar banks in Northwestern Ontario by running online banking workshops for senior centres in Northern Ontario communities. Three members drove to Terrace Bay and Scheiber and presented Making Cents! to those communities impacting 15 lives. After presenting the project at the Enactus Regional Exposition, Alterna Savings Credit Union approached the team and we entered into a working relationship in order to help expand the project to more communities.
- Getting Financially Lit! This project looked at addressing knowledge gaps in budgeting and long-term savings for Indigenous youth who fly in from northern communities to attend Dennis Franklin Cromarty High School, a private First Nations high school in Thunder Bay. The Enactus team conducted a needs assessment by interviewing staff at the Lakehead University Aboriginal Initiatives Department, speaking to Moffat Mokuto from the Northwestern Ontario Multicultural Centre, and attending the Voices of Youth Conference 2019. They were able to run three pilot seminars impacting the lives of 22 Indigenous youth.

#### Karen Boz

akehead University is known for its small class sizes, which allows for Professors to truly get to know their students. While this may be a draw for today, it also was true in the early 1990s when Karen Boz was attending. "We would sometimes be working on case studies until 3:00 am and our professor would be there encouraging us and answering questions. You could tell that our professors honestly had a vested interest in us and wanted to see us succeed."

Karen was born and raised in Thunder Bay, attending Lakehead University for Business Administration with a Major in Personnel/Industrial Relations from 1989 to 1992. Karen made lasting friendships during her time at Lakehead, fondly remembering both classes and socializing in The Study or The Outpost and learning how to downhill ski for the first time.

During her undergraduate, Karen worked part-time at RBC and upon graduation was offered a full-time role. For the first four years post-graduation, Karen remained in Thunder Bay, working in various branches as a Personal Banker and in 1996 she was transferred to a branch in Southern Ontario. Karen continued with her work, transitioning between two branches for the next 5 years before moving to head office, RBC Internal Audit. After two years, Karen moved to North Carolina, still with RBC, to work with Internal Audit there. In 2006 she returned to Canada and has worked in various national office roles since then. In addition to being a Senior Director with RBC, she participated in office events to promote diversity and inclusion and mentors employees looking for career guidance through casual coffee chats. This last year, Karen has volunteered with Toronto Region Immigrant Employment Council (TRIEC), as a mentor to new immigrants to assist them in finding employment in Toronto. Karen is also an active Alumni member, volunteering as the Vice President for the Alumni Board and as a Director (former President) for the GTA Alumni Chapter Committee.

In March, the GTA chapter hosted an event at The Ballroom, which is an entertainment complex in Toronto. With pool tables, a bowling alley, darts, and excellent food, this proved to be an exceptional gathering of Lakehead alumni. Karen is the smiling woman, with blonde hair, second in from the bottom right.

# Lakehead Accounting Graduate Kim Wildhaber ranks among the top 1% of CPA Canada Final Exam Writers

akehead Accounting Graduate Kim Wildhaber ranks among the top 1% of CPA Canada Final Exam Writers This year a total of 6,163 individuals in Canada passed the rigorous Common Final Examination (CFE)—a key step to attaining the prestigious CPA designation.

The CFE is a three-day evaluation designed to assess candidates' knowledge, judgment and skills, and is a critical part of the Canadian CPA certification program.

The CFE Honour Roll is reserved for the top 1% of all CFE writers in Canada. This year, Lakehead University alumnus, Kim Wildhaber, was on the CPA Canada Honour Roll.

Kim graduated from Lakehead University in 2017 with an accounting major and the Dean Braun Medal from the Faculty of Business Administration. Upon graduation, Kim began his career with BDO Canada LLP in Dryden, Ont.

It is at this point that he began to pursue the CPA designation while obtaining practical work experience. "It was not until after I graduated from Lakehead and began studying for my CPA exams that I realized how well Lakehead's accounting program prepared me for the CPA program," said Kim.

"Lakehead's program was well aligned with the CPA Competency Map which allowed me to be so successful throughout the CPA program and place on the national CFE honour roll list. It's an accomplishment I hope to build off of as I continue to learn and progress through the accounting profession and towards my designation."

"Kim was always an exceptional student in our undergraduate program, and I was not surprised to learn that he had distinguished himself at this early stage of his career," said Dr. Camillo Lento, Associate Professor of Accounting at Lakehead University. "Placing on the CFE Honour Roll is a not an easy task, and is a testament to Kim's intelligence, work ethic and determination.

We are all very happy for Kim for this major accomplishment."

#### BDO Accounting and Community Service Scholarship Recipient

The BDO Accounting and Community Service Scholarship is awarded to a student enrolled in the Honours Bachelor of Commerce Degree program who intends to pursue a Chartered Professional Accountant designation. The successful candidate must have



an 80% average, demonstrate community involvement and be a resident of Ontario. This years recipient was Abby Parkes.

Abby was born and raised in Thunder Bay, attended St. Patrick High School and chose to stay close to home when when deciding where to go to university. "I am very fortunate to have a University like Lakehead, with a world renowned program like Business, in my hometown. I didn't want to go away for University."

Entering her fourth and final year this September, Abby is majoring in Accounting and is looking to continue her education, by pursuing her Graduate Diploma in Accounting at Lakehead. Her goal is to obtain her CPA certification. "I have been able to get a taste for what life after school will be like, through working locally at Grant Thornton. Lakehead has really helped prepare me for this, both academically and financially through scholarships."

Abby received the academic entrance scholarship at the end of high school and through hard work and dedication, she has maintained an excellent GPA and has been able to keep it for her entire four years at Lakehead.
