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1. Welcome and Opening Prayer

Mr. Paul Capon, Acting Chair, welcomed members.

The Chair introduced the two new members, Mr. Timothy Michano and Ms. Nicole McKay, the LUNSA President and Vice-President, respectively. Both are students in the Political Science program at Lakehead University.

Everyone introduced themselves around the table.

It was noted that the approval for Dr. Sandra Wolf's tenure is going to the Board of Governors for approval.

Dr. Sandra Wolf led the opening prayer.

2. Approval of Agenda

MOVED (K. Beardy/J. Flett) that the agenda for the January 23, 2012 meeting be approved.

O-AGC held a moment of silence for Mr. Orien A. Corbiere, a graduate of the Native Language Instructors' Program and Dr. Helen Smith, Associate Professor in History and Women's Studies.

4. Approval of Minutes

MOVED (P. Smith/R. Hanley) that the Minutes of the O-AGC meeting of November 21, 2011 be approved with the following amendment:

It was also mentioned that LUNSA would like to promote the sense of community and is willing to work with Dr. Klein. It was noted that LUNSA has been identified as one of the reasons students remain at Lakehead.

5. **New Business**

5.1 Discussion: Follow up on "Duty to Consult"

- Memo from Dr. Scott Hamilton for O-AGC consideration

Dr. Hamilton distributed a letter noting that private and government sectors seem to be failing in duty to consult, particularly mining companies.

Dr. Hamilton suggested the OAGC provide some direction.

The discussion resulted in a list of some ideas about how to proceed from here. These included:

- Providing a workshop on duty to consult
- Developing training modules (as a certificate program) to include world views on duty to consult, history, treaties, and best practices.
- Looking at working on a focus for best practice of community engagement –
 inviting representatives from communities, government, youth, etc. to speak
 in a neutral environment.
- Prepare a toolkit that could be posted to the Aboriginal Initiatives' website and link to Office of Research Services.

The Provost noted that this is an excellent opportunity for O-AGC Advisors to take on the role of identifying the direction Lakehead University will take with this sensitive and important issue.

Dr. Smith noted that she is working with Mr. Dennis McPherson and Ms. Annette Schroeter on putting the materials together to educate communities.

The increase in activity related to mineral development has resulted in challenges such as health, economic, and educational in communities surrounding the Ring of Fire. Thousands of jobs in the mineral development sector and related spin off jobs are anticipated. Aboriginal community involvement has been limited because the level of expertise needed is not present in the communities. Lakehead University may be able to bring certifications and educational training to these communities.

MOVED (J. Flett/ N. McKay) that the Ad Hoc Committee on Duty to Consult meet to discuss and identify options related to Lakehead University's involvement in training and education related to Duty to Consult in the Ring of Fire communities and that the Ad Hoc Committee bring recommendations back to the O-AGC for further discussion.
