## BOARD OF GOVERNORS' REPORT November 19, 2012

The Board of Governors' met on November 2, 2012.

- 1. <u>An Orientation/Re-Orientation</u> for the board of governors was held in the morning. Topics included risk Management Overview, Bicameral Governance Senate/Board Relationship, Communications, Roles, Skills, Knowledge, and Governance & Nominating Board Roles and Responsibilities.
- 2. Committee of the Whole Meeting saw three presentations followed by discussions:
  - i) Branding & Strategic Plan
    - Fifty branding company retained in spring 2012 and began process in June
    - primary and secondary research done June Nov
    - next step online survey out to all audiences Nov, BoG Branding session Nov or Dec, develop creative approach.
  - ii) Strategic Plan update overall the consultation process has been very successful. There have been more than 20 meetings with a large variety of faculty, staff, students and the community. The comments have been thoughtful and respectful and we have gotten some very good ideas. The major areas where additional work needs to be done are the Mission, Vision, Community Engagement and Economic Development. The BoG will receive a draft of the revised Strategic Plan by Jan 18 and have a last chance to comment on it.
  - iii) Enrolment report at LU Greenstone area declining demographics in student population by 65% 11/12 enrolment figure was 8681, 12/13 is 8692, a variance of +11
