Course Content: We will cover the majority of the textbook material. By the end of the course students will be able to: summarize raw data graphically; calculate measures of central tendency and variation for data sets and distributions; compute basic probabilities and expected values; make predictions using the normal distribution; construct and utilize confidence intervals; perform hypothesis testing and draw appropriate conclusions; describe relationships between variables using correlation coefficients and regression lines; use the chi-square distribution to analyze sample data; and compare two or more population means using one way Analysis of Variance.

Labs: The half hour lab after lecture will give students the opportunity to ask questions about course content and practice problems. There will also be participation quizzes given during lab time (see "Bonus Marks").

Class Policies: Showing up to class on time, keeping your phone on silent, sitting in the back of the class if using a laptop computer, and limiting talking to outside of the classroom are all ways to respect myself and your fellow students. Tests: There will be two tests given during lecture time, tentatively scheduled for Thursday October 4th and Thursday November 8th. You will be allowed a nonprogrammable calculator and one double-sided 8.5x11" sheet of notes. Please note that there will be **no** makeup tests. If a legitimate and documented reason is given (i.e. doctor's note) no later than 10 days after missing a test, then the weight will be transferred to the other test.

Final Exam: The final exam will be scheduled by the registrar during the examination period. You will be allowed a nonprogrammable calculator and two double-sided 8.5x11" sheets of notes. The final will be a three hour cumulative exam.

Bonus Marks: There will be nine online quizzes during lab time throughout the semester. These will be completed via myCourseLink for participation and not graded. Each quiz completed will earn one extra mark on the final exam, for a total of up to 9% bonus on your final exam grade.
