Exams: There will be two midterm exams on **October 28** and **November 25**, during the **lab hour**. The final exam will be scheduled by the registrar's office. The exams will be closed book with no calculators or other aids allowed.

Grade: Each of the midterm exams will be worth 25% of your final grade. The homework will count for 10%, and the final exam 40%. Please note that no alternate grading scheme will be used in this course.

Homework: Assignments are given as topics are covered in class. Assignments will be collected and graded online using the free online homework system WeBWorK. Further information will be provided during the next couple of weeks.

Course content: The course will cover the topics on vectors and operations on vectors, space coordinates, lines, planes, surfaces in space, vectorvalued functions and their differentiation and integration, tangent vectors and normal vectors, functions of several variables, limits, continuity, partial derivatives of functions of several variables, tangent planes and normal lines, iterated integrals, double integrals, triple integrals, volume and surface areas, Jacobians, line integrals, Green's Theorem, surface integrals, Divergence Theorem, Stokes' Theorem.

Lab Hour: (Monday 8:30-9:30 in RB 1042) No new material will be covered

in the lab. The lab will reinforce concepts through examples, as well as provide students with the opportunity to ask questions about the content given in class or assignment problems. Though the lab is not mandatory, it is beneficial to attend.

If you miss the midterm for a legitimate reason which you can document (e.g. doctor's note), the weight of the midterm will be *transferred* to the final exam.
